Several carloads of chips were piled up in from oil, as they had been run through a machine that removed it. Soon after the rubbish fire had been started smoke was seen coming from the steel pile, and it was discovered that some of the steel was white hot. Water seemed to int out the blaze, but after a drenching the steel began burning again and it was two days before the fire was all out. The manufacturer's theory was that, after the steel had been started by heat from the neighboring fire, the fine chips presented so much surface to oxygen and the surface of the pile gave comparatively so little area for radiation that the steel just had to burn.

A gasoline-driven motor mower controlled from a motor boat cuts the seaweed which is then loadd into a scow, brought to the shore and dried in the sun. 


