## CRUISER "ALERT"

Yesterday, after the case of the Alert had again been brought up in the House, instruction had been sent to Customs Officer Young at North Sydney, instructing him not to allow the Alert to take on any more passengers or freight at any time without instructions from Ottawa. The reply from Mr. Young was that the Alert had left that afternoon again for Neil's Harbor and had taken a number of passengers with their luggage.

On receipt of this telegram Dr. Reid promptly had a wire sent to Officer Young suspending him from office and another wire was sent ordering the Alert out of commission.

The fact remains that before the government acted the Alert had twice carried Conservative workers and their luggage to the scene of political operations in Victoria county.

## AERIAL OMNIBUS PRONOUNCED SUCCESS

Paris, Feb. 5.—Paul Schmidt, an engineer, has succeeded in constructing an aeroplane with extraordinary lifting capacity and which he claims will revolutionize long distance tours and also make an aerial omnibus service feasible.

In a trial of the machine, with seven men aboard and carrying an aggregate weight of a ton and a half, the new air craft rose to a height of about five thousand feet in half an hour.

Among the devices on the aeroplane is one by which its speed can be regulated at will, from seventy-five to twenty-six miles an hour. An ingenious arrangement of the wings permits the new machine to rise without the customary violent manipulation of the elevating planes.

## CANADA TURNS DOWN ALDWYCH SITE SCHEME

Ottawa, Feb. 5.—Lord Chelmsford, who was recently governor of New South Wales and formerly governor of Queensland, has been in Ottawa for about a week. His mission is to advocate participation by Canada in Earl Grey's scheme to concentrate the officers of the Overseas governments of the British empire in the centre of London on what is known as the "Aldwych site." Lord Chelmsford's mission will not be successful, as it is learned authoritatively that Canada will not participate in the scheme.

Earl Grey, who promoted the scheme, secured an option on the site formed a company entitled the "Dominion Site Limited" and got a design for a building to accommodate the London offices of Canada, South Africa, Australia and New Zealand. Canada was to have the centre of the block.

It is understood that the late Lord Strathcona was asked to report on the scheme and that he reported unfavorably.

## CELEBRATED DIVORCE BY GIVING DINNER

Christiania, Feb. 5.—Mme. Brun, wife of a wholesale merchant, recently obtained a divorce decree against her husband. Neither regarded the severance as a domestic tragedy. During the six years of married life they enjoyed much happiness. They resolved to celebrate the divorce with a dinner and ball so that all the world might know they parted friends. With this object the divorce celebration was held at the same hotel where six years before the wedding feast had taken place and every guest who attended the wedding was invited.

## BRAZILIAN MILLIONAIRE SUED FOR HALF-MILLION

New York, Feb. 5.—A Supreme Court action was started yesterday by Miss Monica T. Borden, a beautiful girl of nineteen, living with her parents at 668 Riverside Drive, for the recovery of \$500,000 damages from Octavio Guinle, Brazilian millionaire importer, of No. 42 Broadway. She alleges he failed to keep his promise to marry her and fearing Guinle might sail for the south yesterday, thus escaping the jurisdiction of the court, Miss Borden had him arrested and held in custody until he had filed a bond for \$50,000 to assure his presence in court.

## UNITED STATES TO SEEK SOUTH AMERICAN TRADE

New York, Feb. 6.—More than one hundred representative business men of Chicago and the Central West have arrived in this city preparatory to sailing on the steamship Vauban tomorrow on a two-months' cruise to Buenos Ayres and return. The Illinois Manufacturers' Association has arranged the excursion, which has as its chief purpose the stimulation of trade between the United States and the South American countries. En route to Buenos Ayres stops will be made at Barbados, Para, Pernambuco, Bahia, Rio de Janeiro, Montevideo and several other points. From Buenos Ayres some of the party will make the overland journey to Santiago and Valparaiso, Chile.

## NEBRASKA PROGRESSIVES TO MEET IN CONFERENCE

Lincoln, Neb., Feb. 6.—Preparations are about completed for the conference to be held here next week by the Nebraska Progressives to discuss the party plans for the next state campaign. A feature of the gathering will be a banquet at which ex-Senator Beveridge of Indiana, Jas R. Garfield of Ohio, William Allen White of Kansas, and several other Progressive leaders of national prominence will speak.

## WESTERN AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE CO-OPERATE

Logan, Utah, Feb. 6.—Important and far-reaching results are expected to follow a conference of Western agricultural colleges which met at the Utah State Agricultural College here today for a two days' session. The initial stimulus to the movement came from Senator Brady of Idaho, who, at the national meeting of agricultural colleges in Washington last November, suggested to a few inter-mountain representatives the necessity of uniting the far Western colleges in order to get proper support from the national legislation, as the inter-mountain States have a small congressional representation as compared with other parts of the country. The States represented at the Conference are Idaho, Utah, Colorado, Washington, Oregon, Montana and Wyoming. The subjects up for discussion include the standardizing of extension work, co-operation in experimental work to avoid duplication, and the securing of needed State and national legislation.

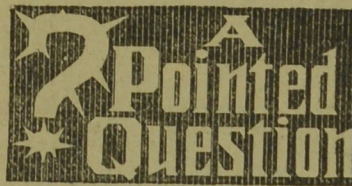
