## THE TORIES WERE NEARLY ANNIHILATED

returning officer and his constables have supreme authority over all others.

With the proper protection of the polls on Thursday, the result is a foregone conclusion. The Liberals have not been indulging in boasting, but have been hard at work and, with these reports from every constituency in the province before them, are not merely sanguine but absolutely and enthusiastically confident of the result, namely, the return of the Scott Government to power on Thursday with a larger majority than that Government has enjoyed at any time since the creation of a Province.

Winnipeg, July 12—Speaking of the result in Saskatchewan, Dr. R. M. Simpson, president of the Winnipeg Conservative Association, said this morning that such a sweep is not good for the government, admitting the same rule applies wherever there is no opposition, such a state of affairs tending to make the ministry autocratic.

The latter stages of the election were fought out purely on federal issues.

In the last house, the Scott Government held 27 seats to the opposition 14. The ratio being two to one. In the next house according to returns so far received, the Scott Government will hold about 16 seats to the opposition eight, the ratio being nearly six to one. Forty seats are sure for the government and four seats are for the Conservatives. There are two deferred elections which will doubtless go to the government and there are eight seats from which practically no returns have yet been received. Of these if the Liberal candidates win only half which is expected, the standing will be 46 to 8.

Reilly of Connecticut. The baseball was the one which the President threw to "Sik" O'Loughlin, the umpire, at the opening of the season here. O'Loughlin promptly put the ball in his pocket and saved it as a souvenir.
