MILLIONS FOR FOOD

The incidence of taxation upon food and the manner in which it weighs with special severity upon the wage-earning classes, is easily apparent from an examination of the customs returns for last year. For instance, during the year ending last March, Canada imported from the United States foodstuffs to the value of \$23,072,160, on which duties amounting to \$4,816,787.82 were collected. From Great Britain foodstuffs to the value of \$5,358,568 were imported, and even with the British preference the duties upon this amounted to \$1,075,480.88. France supplied us with food to the value of \$1,096,001 and before it could reach the tables of the Canadian consumers almost \$100,000 had to be paid imto the Dominion treasury.
