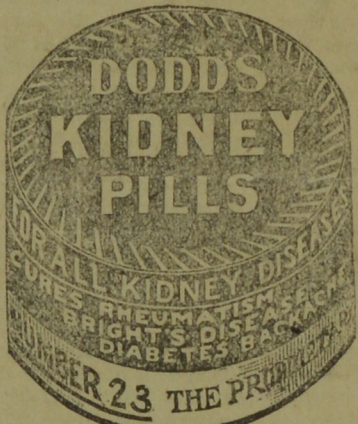

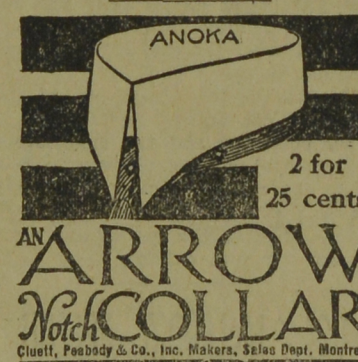

HAS ACHIEVED SUCCESS IN THE BANKING WORLD

Financial Writer in Toronto Paper warm-
ly Praises Mr. C. E. Neill a Fredericton
Boy, Who is Now a Director and Assis-
tant General Manager of the Royal Bank
of Canada

(Toronto Saturday Night.)
Mr. C. E. Neill of the Royal Bank
of Canada, was the recipient of many
congratulations at the conclusion of
the annual meeting of the bank held
here last week and at which he was
made director. It was not generally
remembered that the bank was to
appoint a director at its meeting so
that the election of Mr. Neill came
somewhat as a surprise. It must be
said, however, that there has seldom
been an appointment of this charac-
ter, from the younger men of the
community, which was considered so
well deserved and which was so un-
animously approved of by the Street.
Charles Ernest Neill is a native of
New Brunswick, having been born in
Fredericton in May, 1873, and being
thus about forty-one years of age.
He received his schooling in his
native town and spent his early life
in the Eastern Provinces. He was
still a youth when he made applica-
tion for employment with the Royal
Bank and obtained it. Ever since he
has been in the service of that pro-
gressive bank.

When I said he made application
for employment with the Royal Bank
I was about as accurate as the boy
who still carried his grandfather's
jack-knife—only its blade and handle
had been renewed various times until
the old gentleman would not recog-
nize it. In like manner, it was not
the Royal Bank of Canada with
which C. E. Neill first became em-
ployed but the Merchants Bank in
Halifax. Later the Merchants of
Halifax became the Royal of Canada
the headquarters were removed to
Montreal and in the course of time
other banking institutions were ab-
sorbed and the business extended un-
til we have the Royal Bank of Can-
ada as it stands today, with annual
profits of upwards of two million
dollars and the business of the West
Indies in its pocket in addition to an
ever-increasing share of the business
of Canada. If it isn't a brand new
blade and handle, it is a very good
imitation.

In the old days Mr. Kerny was pre-
sident of the bank and Mr. Neill's
early experience was in large part
with him. Kerny was regarded as
one of the most active presidents
any Canadian bank ever had and in
accompanying him in his different
visits of inspection to the branches,
young Neill had excellent opportuni-
ties of absorbing much banking wis-
dom which afterwards stood him in
good stead. Apparently he had

While his time is mainly taken up
with banking work and while he is
said to possess unusual knowledge in
recognizing the possibilities of finan-
cial problems coming before him, he
is no less keen to take advantage of
opportunities for out-door life. He
comes from a family of marksmen and
as a boy of seventeen or eighteen, he
attained considerable distinction as a
crack shot, being at one time said to
have been the best shot in the east.
His sports of later life have become
mainly golf in summer and curling in
