CONFERENCE OF WESTERN GOVERNORS

Denver, Colo., April 7-The confer ence of western governors, which was organized at Salt Lake City a tendance includes the governors or their delegated representatives from California, Idaho, Arizona, Colorado, North and South Dakota, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, Oregon, Utah, Washington and Wyoming.

The purpose of the conference is to unite the Western States in a definite policy on public questions of common interest. The most important of these guestions are those with which the states have to deal with the federal government, such as fotrstry, irrigation, water power and the conservation of the natural resources in general. The conference also will agree upon a program for the Westrn Irrigation Congress, which is to meet here Thursday in response to the call recently issued by Secretary Lane of the Interior Department.
