### PREMIER FLEMMING HAD NARROW ESCAPE TODAY

Huge Fragment of Ice Fell From Roof  
of Parliament Building and Crash-  
ed Through Window of  
His Office

Hon. J. K. Flemming, premier of New Brunswick, and minister of lands and mines, had a narrow escape from serious injury at his office this morning. A huge fragment of ice fell from the roof of the Parliament Buildings and shot across the alleyway separating it from the Departmental Building. It crashed through the window of the office of Hon. Mr. Flemming, shattering both outside and inside sashes and fell upon the chair of the premier with terrific force.

Hon. Mr. Flemming had been occupying the chair but a moment before. Had he remained in his chair instead of moving to another part of the office he would have been seriously, possibly fatally injured.

Speaking of the accident later the premier remarked that had he not moved when he did the program for the opening of the legislature this afternoon would have had to suffer alteration.

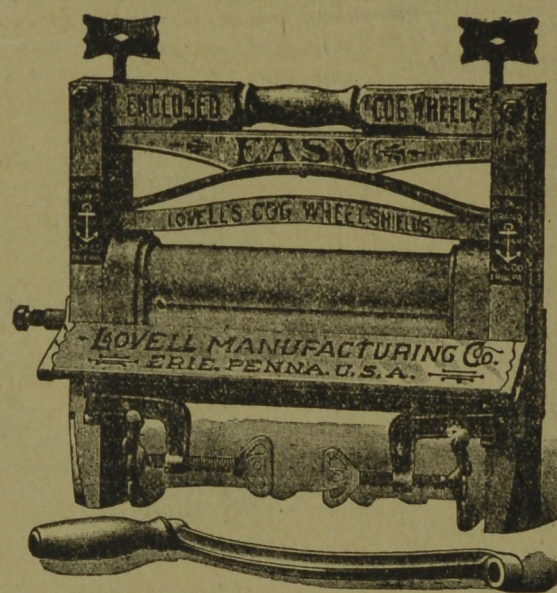
