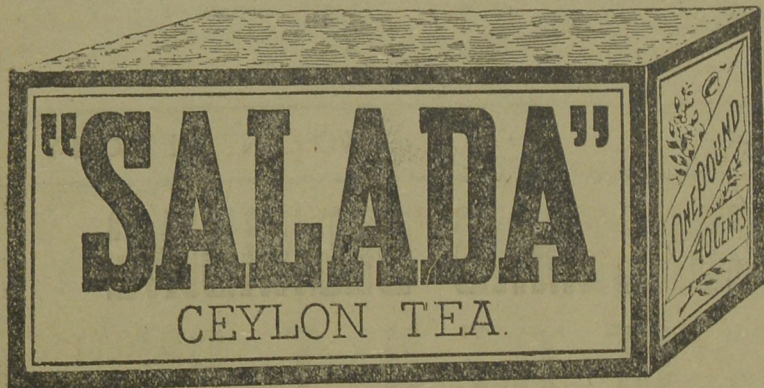

this very important detail. The walls and columns are of mahogany, rosewood and marquetry inlay. The room is provided with a sideboard which, while large, is so perfect in scale, so cleverly designed, that one is not conscious of its remarkable size. The windows are tastefully draped with simple hangings of velvet with valances narrow in width and colored in harmony with the general scheme of the room. The dining tables and chairs are of mahogany and bronze, the chairs being upholstered with tapetery of the same soft green used throughout. One's attention is called to the unique arrangements in use for the serving

table, it being practically a self-cooker in addition to being a serving table. The arrangements has been found to work admirably and a great saver of time and an immense convenience so far as relieving the kitchen of part of its work during rush times.

A large staff of obliging colored waiters, neatly dressed, attend to the wants of the inner man and give a service which is well nigh perfect. The beautiful silverware and dishes all bearing the vest of arms of the Northern Navigation Company, are sure to attract more than a passing notice.

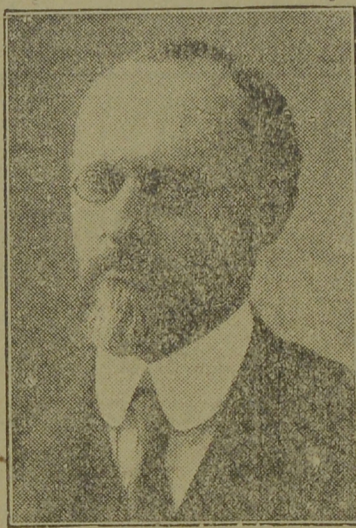
The dining-room and observation room are separated by a folding glass partition, near which is located the orchestra stand. An orchestra is employed on the ship and in order to convert the observation-room into a ball-room, it is only necessary to remove the costly and beautiful rugs from the polished oaken floor. The tourist on pleasure bent is sure to appreciate this feature of this great floating palace.

### ELABORATE FURNISHINGS.

The interior furnishings of the Noronic are of the most elaborate nature and it is not to be wondered at that it took an army of skilled workmen a year to finish the ship after she was launched. The walls and ceilings of many of the rooms are of mahogany and rosewood and the carpets and furniture are the most costly and elaborate that money can buy; in fact nothing has been left undone that will contribute to the comfort and convenience of passengers. The grand staircase, the grand salon, the social room, drawing-room and parlors are models of architectural beauty and the wonder and admiration of passengers. The carved panels in the grand salon tell the story in a poetical manner of the passing of the element from the mountain to the sea.

This great steamer, which is known as "the Empress of the Great Lakes," will ply on the Lake Superior route, between Sarnia, Ont., and Duluth,

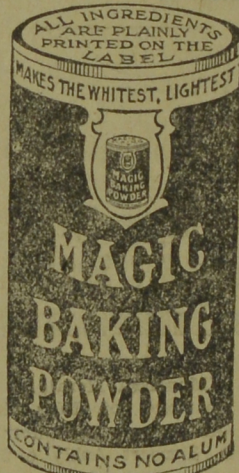
Minn., via Sault Ste. Marie, Port Arthur and Fort William. Like all modern steamships, the Noronic is equipped with a powerful wireless telegraphy outfit and messages are received and forwarded at all times, no matter what the weather conditions may be. She has a double bottom and water-tight compartments, and carries a full complement of life-boats.

The Noronic has a passenger arrangement with the Grand Trunk and Grand Trunk Pacific railway companies. 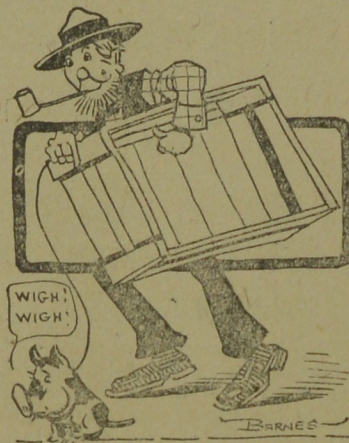
American railroads placed contracts during first quarter of this year for 590,000 tons of rails, 21,819 cars, 455 locomotives, and 68,000 tons of structural steel.
