BIG BANKING  
HOUSE FAILS  
IN LONDON

London, June 7.—The all absorbing topic of conversation on change yesterday was the news that the Chaplin, Mine, Grenfell Company had suspended payment, with liabilities totalling in the neighborhood of \$25,000,000.

The market, however, was not altogether surprised as the affairs of the firm have been troubling the market for some time. When in the middle of last month the heavy commitments of Arthur M. Grenfell were taken over by a strong group, it was hoped that the trouble had been avoided. A fortnight ago, however, rumors were again busy and the renewal of liquidation of certain Canadian and oil securities proved the last straw.

The suspended bank stands on Princess Street opposite to the Bank of England. It has a capital of \$1,750,000 with thirty-three shareholders.

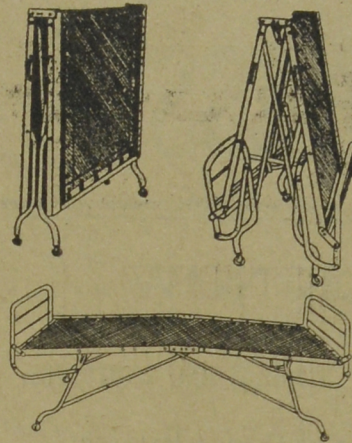
MAY MERGE
