## PETS DOUBLED SCORE ON IMPERIALS LAST EVENING

Won 6 to 3 in Six-Inning Game---

The Pets doubled the score on the Imperials in six innings at the College Field last night, the tally being 6 to 3. Charlie Barry had the Imps eating out of his hand most of the time and received fairly good support. Clark, who had been a considerable mystery to the Celestial League teams this season, was banged early and often by the Pets.

The game started off with a war-like demonstration by Catcher McLean of the Imperials, which was the most aggressive thing the Imps showed until the sixth inning, when an eleventh hour rally came too late to pull down the Pets' lead of five runs.

In the first inning Clark was touched up for three singles, which, with an error, netted two runs for the Pets. In the second three more singles and a sacrifice gave two more runs. Until the fifth the Imps held them down but in that inning "Judge" Barry broke things up with a two-base clout and four singles followed. Only two runs came in, however, the Imps tightening up toward the last.

The Imperials failed to do damage till the third inning, when a couple of singles and a sacrifice gave them one. In the sixth the Pets went bad and made two errors which, with a brace of singles, made two more.

The race in the league has tightened up and some interesting play is expected.

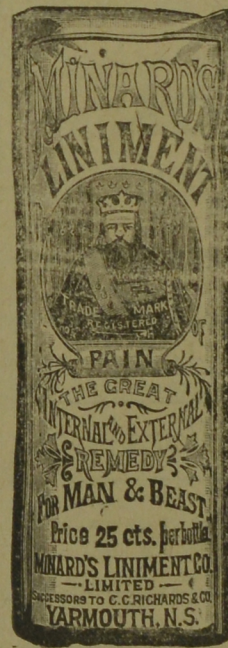

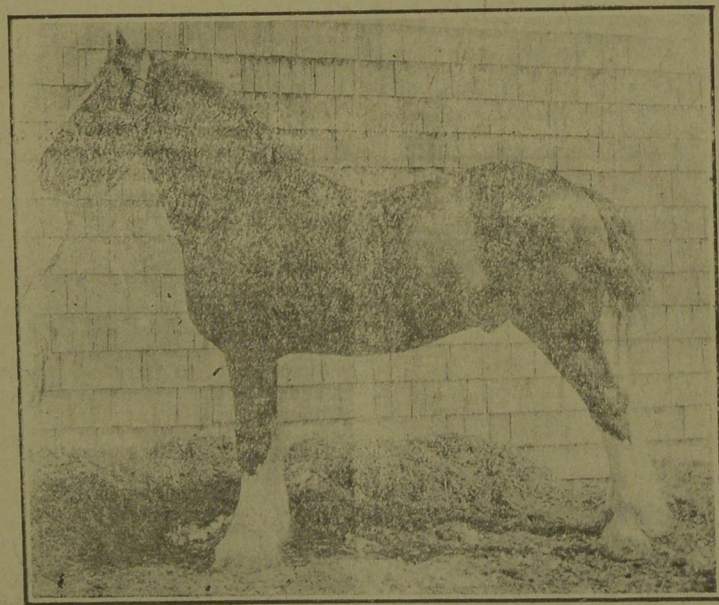

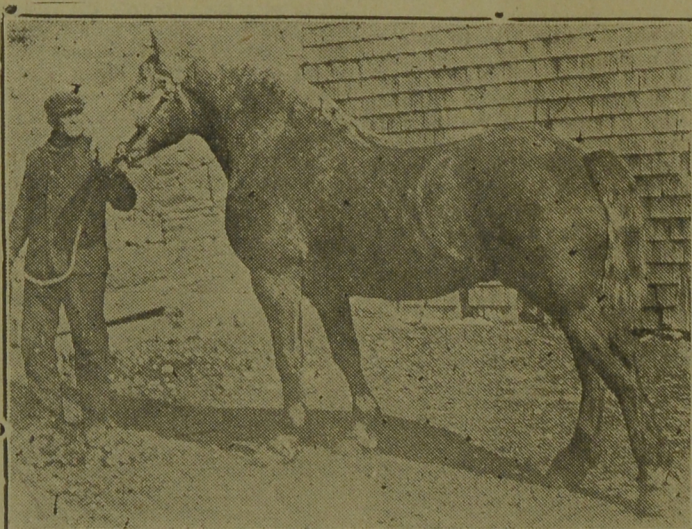
