FOREIGNERS AND HALF BREEDS

Winnipeg, July 16—The popular majority against the Roblin governmeot as pronounced by the electors last Friday is 10,000. Over 138,000 votes were cast, and of these Roblin candidates polled only 64,271 or 9,759 less than the total of the votes cast for the Liberal and Independent candidates. The government percentage of the total vote fell fro 50.77 four years ago, to 46.47 this

In previous contests the Roblin government has never commanded a striking percentage of the popular vote, but it did have a bare majority Leaving out all the Independents, the Liberals had 30,000 majority over the Roblin votes.

As to the outlook the Liberals have 21 and the Conservatives 25 stats. The Liberals are almost "cer tain to win Kildonan, where Dr. Montaque has a majority of three and the indications are that they will win Lepas, making the final standing 23 to 26, which, after the election of a speaker, gives the government a bare majority. But it is not in the majority their weakness is shown, but the sentiment throughout the city of Winnipeg where Liberals have a majority of 2,000 over all, and in the pioneer farming districts of Manitoba, the great mack bone of the country, where the Lib. erals swent the districts. Half-breeds and foreibners gave the Roblin gov-ernment the majority with which to iphold the British constitution
