the refusal as given being twofold:—(1) "That it would appear as persecution." (2) "That the request was considered merely a joke."

(4) The delay in bringing the case to trial had been in favor of the defence.

And whereas the impression made upon those present dealing with at the sessions of the court dealing with the matter who were in favor of the Scott Act was that the sympathies of the court were entirely prejudicial to the vigorous enforcement of the Scott Act in the city.

And whereas, it is the conviction of the Ministerial Association that this whole procedure is symptomatic of the civic situation with regard to the Scott Act enforcement, Therefore resolved, that the Ministerial Association considers the moral situation so desperately serious that it feels under obligation to place these matters before the public with the most earnest hope that the citizens knowing the facts as they really exist will rise in their might and make such demands as will render it impossible for this travesty of Scott Act enforcement to be perpetuated.

Smith, the Conservative candidate in the Carleton riding in the last two federal elections. Mr. Smith had a license to cut burnt timber but cut green in violation of his license. The greater part of the green timber cut was on the south side of the Tobique. Mr. Smith was allowed to purchase the land from which this timber was cut at an upset price based on the value of the land and of the timber. For the timber which he cut on the north side of the river he is charged triple dues, his payments amounting to \$28.18.

Hon. L. P. Pelletier stated, in reply to F. F. Pardee, that the post office department had under consideration the payment of higher wages to letter carriers and rural couriers on account of the parcels post system.

Hon. W. B. Nantel introduced a bill to amend the weights and measures act. Under the law as it now stands the use of the metric system is permissible but the Canadian law at present authorizes local standards of measurement. The bill introduced by Mr. Nantel merely adopts for use in Canada the standards already in force under the International Bureau of Weights and Measures. This will enable scientists and business men who desire accurate metric measurements to obtain them in Canada instead of going to Paris as is now necessary.

As a matter of privilege Sir Wilfrid Laurier was given permission to move the resolution of which he already gave notice with respect to the participation in elections of the deputy speaker. The resolution read as follows:

"That in the opinion of this House, in the discharge of the duties and the responsibility of the deputy speaker towards this House, he is bound by and subject to the same rules as apply to Mr. Speaker, and that, therefore, he is debarred from taking part in electoral contests."

Sir Wilfrid said that the first rule of the House of Commons stated that Canada adopted British procedure generally as it existed at the time of confederation. One of the most important rules of the British House was that the speaker was not allowed to take part in political contests or discussions. This had been observed in Canada.

Mr. Borden, after speaking to the motion, asked that this matter be allowed to stand and this was agreed to.
