MONTAUK AVENUE BAPTISTS MAKE APPEAL TO PUBLIC

(The Day, New London, Conn.)

On June the fourth the Montauk Avenue Baptist Church was accidentally burned to the ground. The Rev. H. F. Adams came to this church just four years ago. The outlook was dark. With six male and twenty six female members, a half finished building, \$500 local debts and a mortgage of nearly \$12,000 it was a very hard task for one to grapple with. Besides, the mortgagee determined to sell the church unless better security were given him. The pastor secured a petition of 72 men and 72 women (among the signers were seven pastors) requesting the convention to carry the mortgage for five years. The convention board decided to do so on condition that the pastor raise the local debts of \$508 in one month, which he did. Unitedly and with faith and works, pastor and people wrought hard and persistently. During the four years the 32 members have been increased to 103; the church building and parsonage finished at a cost of 4,000 besides raising nearly \$10,000 for current expenses and missions. The Sunday School has 365 enrolled, with an average attendance of between 175 and 200. Also there are the Y.P.S.C. Endeavor, Ladies' Auxiliary, Women's Foreign Mission, circle, Oria circle, Very Best Girls circle, Fellowship fund and the Church Missionary fund. The church uses the duplex envelopes, every member contributing to missions weekly. The church was finished inside and out and was replete with everything to make a great workshop for our Master, including a dozen class rooms, practically separate, for our Sunday School. In one hour everything was burned to the ground. This great calamity leaves the church thus: The \$10,000 mortgage is lifted by the \$10,000 insurance on the church. The parsonage was insured for \$2,000. Of this sum the insurance company allows \$600 to restore it to its former condition. The church has the site and some \$400 worth of junk in the ruins, but nothing over from the insurance, it being insured for only the amount of the mortgage. Some criticize the small amount of insurance, but the struggle was too great for the church to carry more.

Shall the church be rebuilt? The church members cannot answer that question, as all are working people, only three male members owning a cottage. But as this is the only Protestant English speaking church in the community (the nearest being one mile away) and with 1,000 children all around, there is a great need for the church. The church members will raise \$1,000 from their hard earnings toward the new house. Very many have expressed a desire to help, and will, but unless some large contributions are made by those interested in the army of children around the church, it cannot be rebuilt. The first great need is a modern Sunday school hall that will accommodate five hundred scholars.

New England will do its share of the \$20,000 need, but the church asks every Baptist church in Connecticut to kindly take an offering for this work on Sunday, July 12. On Saturday, July 11, the members of the church, congregation and young people will cover the city of New London and adjacent towns for the citizens' contribution to the rebuilding of the church. Until the church can have some idea what will be raised by the friends of the work it can form no definite plan for rebuilding.

The chairman of the finance committee for rebuilding is the Rev. H. F. Adams, 314 Montauk Avenue, New London, Conn., and the treasurer of the building fund is Murray K. Patton, 88 Jefferson Avenue, New London, Conn.

In his attempt to raise money to replace the destroyed edifice we commend him to the generous interest of all. The Montauk Avenue Baptist church is the only English speaking Protestant church in a large and rapidly growing section of New London. The need of a commodious and tasty house of

worship will be apparent to every one.

The Connecticut Baptist State convention has been closely identified with the work in this church for some years and stands ready to back this new enterprise to the fullest extent of its power. We ask from all to whom Mr. Adams may apply a generous response to his appeal.

WEDDING PRESENTS BRIDE'S PROPERTY

Buckinghamshire County Court Gives
Decision to Tois Effect

According to a decision just given in a Buckinghamshire County Court wedding presents sent to a bride are her exclusive property, and her husband has no right to regard them as joint possessions.

"The law is quite clear on the point," a well known lawyer informed a Daily Chronicle representative "if the gifts are addressed to the bride personally they are undoubtedly hers, just as gifts addressed to the bridegroom are his."

A society leader, however, pointed out a difficulty. "When a friend of both the bride and bridegroom desires to make the couple a gift she can't very well address it to Mr. and Mrs. A. before they are Mr. and Mrs. A.," she remarked, "so the present is usually addressed to the bride. It is always understood that when the giver is a personal friend of both parties the gift is a joint affair."

"Of course, when the donor is a friend of the bride alone the gift addressed to her is a personal matter. But in all other cases society usage, if not the law, regards wedding presents as the property of the bride and bridegroom jointly."
