Fredericton's Heavy Tax-payers for the Current Year

The tax notices are being served on ratepayers of the city. The service began yesterday and a protest was filed with the chief assessor shortly afterward. On account of the increase in the total assessment and in the rate there is a noticeable increase in taxes.

The Mail today publishes a list of all who are assessed upwards of \$75. F. B. Edgecombe has the distinction of being taxed the largest amount of any individual in Fredericton, his assessment totalling \$1094.00. Other large ratepayers are H. G. Kitchen \$890.50, Hugh Calder \$859.65, James Hodge Estate \$933.08. The F. B. Edgecombe Company has the heaviest assessment of any business house the amount being \$1196.50. R. Chestnut & Sons and J. S. Neil & Sons each are assessed \$1039.50. The Bank of Nova Scotia pay the heaviest assessment of any bank, the tax totalling \$1800.09. From business taxes upon the various insurance companies which do business in the city the amount realized is \$1429.24.
