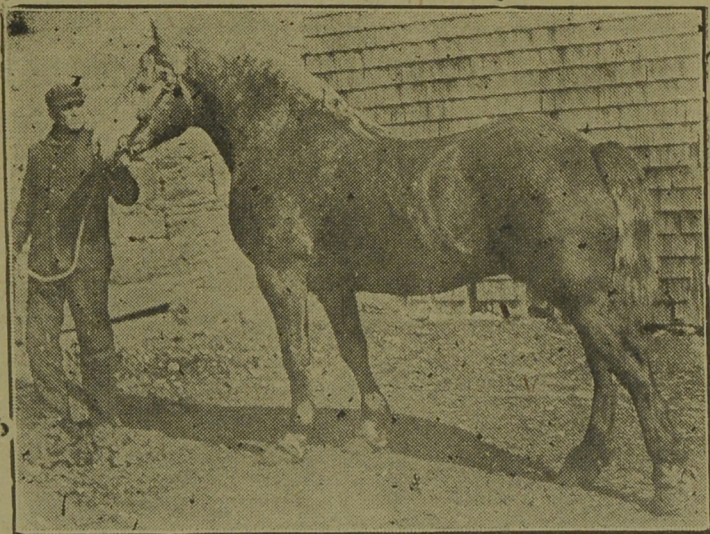

**SHAMROC IV
TO HAVE LEAD
TAKEN FROM KEEL**

Challenger Looks Good But Further Improved—Rig Also to be Altered

Portsmouth, England, June 15—Sir Thomas Lipton's challenger for the American Cup, Shamrock IV, has today gone into dry dock.

It is understood that the yacht is to be considerably lightened, and that four tons of lead is to be taken from her keel. This, it is believed, will materially increase the speed of the yacht.

Yesterday, over a fifteen mile course, the new challenger again demonstrated her remarkable power when sailing to the windward. In racing against the old Shamrock III the new craft raced away and over the windward turn of four and three-quarters miles, showed a gain of about six miles.

It is also expected that alterations to the new Shamrock's rig are under consideration.

A quarter in 28½ is charged up to the Colorado stake trotter Pass All 2:13½.

They say that the new half-mile track at Detroit is the fastest in the country.
