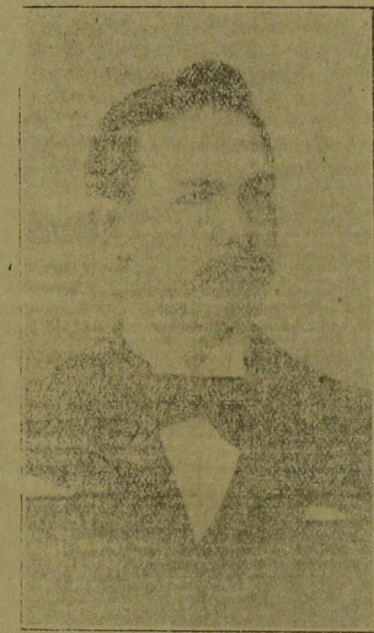

spring handkerchief is noteworthy because of its lack of consistency. On some handkerchiefs the hems are two inches wide, either white or colored. Others, there is a tiny hem not more than an eighth of an inch wide, applied in a contrasting color.

In the wide-hemmed handkerchiefs the initials are worked in the hem in the corner, where the hems are turned and hemstitched to form a square. Sometimes this wide hem is embroidered with floral design, just as a narrow hemmed handkerchief is embroidered.
