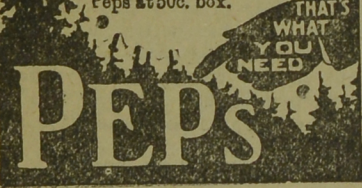

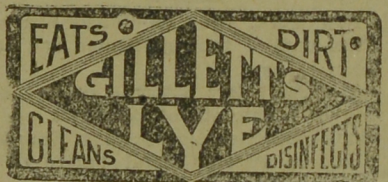
NOT IN SEISMIC AREA

Canadians Need Not Fear Danger From Earthquakes

Over the greater part of Canada, says a report of the Dominion Observatory, we need have no fear of any disastrous earthquakes; we have too near the primeval rock; we have too few formations beneath us in which the compression and adjustment take place. The weak line of the surface of the earth in Eastern Canada, an old wound that would be the first to open afresh, if strains were to become excessive, is the Great Champlain fault running down the bed of the St. Lawrence from Levis to the Gulf.

Mild quakes which are sometimes experienced in the Dominion are described as very minute manifestations of the pent up energy of the earth although to us, small crawlers on the surface, they arouse fear and trembling in some quarters. The earth is always under strain and from various causes.

INDIAN HEAD BARN

On the Experimental Farm at India Head there is a wonderful barn. Cement work was very largely used in the construction of both the stable and barn, which was completed last autumn, and barn, as both have a 10 foot wall of cement. This material was also used in the floor and walls of the horse stable and of the basement of the barn, which will be used for the winter feeding of cattle.

The horse stable, which is a huge affair, is splendidly fitted up in every way, while the barn is the last cry in barn-structure. Its dimensions are 48 feet by 116 feet with an elevation of 52 feet. This height gives the building an added appearance of immensity, especially from inside, but there are no posts; the barn is framed with eight large bents, with hip roof.

A goodly space on the ground floor is reserved for work shop, and granaries have also a generous allowance; the windows are hung on weights, and can be easily lowered, indeed, taking it all in all, the barn is so very fine a structure that the fire which destroyed the old buildings may now be regarded as more of a blessing than a curse.

FRESTON TOWER

Each Storey Was Designed For a Specific Purpose

At Freston, near Ipswich, stands a picturesque building known as Freston Tower, which was constructed under somewhat romantic circumstances. The owner of the estate upon which the tower stands was Lord de Freston whose beautiful daughter, Ellen, possessed intellectual abilities of a high order. Fearing that in her achievements would be attained at the expense of her natural grace and beauty, advice was tendered to the anxious Lord de Freston to "build a tower six storeys high, each one with purpose known." One That is Valued at \$30,000—Costly Wearing Apparel

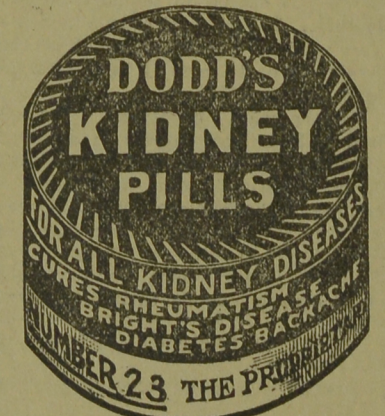
