felt that it might be advisable for the School Trustees to confer with him and find his opinion as to the branches of technical education which would be most suitable to Fredericton. Such an opinion would be of considerable value and should be obtained before any definite course of action is decided upon.

A. R. SLIPP, M.P.P.

Mr. A. R. Slipp, M.P.P., stated that it might be well to ask a conference between the Board of School Trustees and the Board of Trade. He thought as a Board of Trade that body should be aggressive and create public opinion favorable to technical education. The Board could well follow the lead taken by the president, Mr. Palmer.

C. F. CHESTNUT.

Mr. C. Fred Chestnut stated that money spent upon technical education would not be an expenditure, but an investment. The Board of Trade should agitate for the introduction of technical education in Fredericton. For every dollar spent on such there would be a return to the community. Raw materials should not be allowed to go out of the country in an unmanufactured state. In this connection he made particular reference to the hardwood grown in this section much of which was being burnt at the present time.

OTHER OPINION.

Messrs. J. T. Jennings and W. A. Searle also spoke strongly in favor of technical education in the city schools. Mr. Jennings instanced the great benefits which had come from this source in other large American cities. Mr. Searle pointed out the ease in securing stenographers and bookkeepers and difficulty in securing skilled labor.

Ald. W. G. Clarke and J. M. Lemont stated that the School Board delegation in applying to the City Council in connection with legislation for a new bond issue had stated that the School Trustees had passed a resolution to the effect that the new Smythe street building would be for the purpose of primary education.

The board adjourned without any action on the matter being taken.

The feeling is abroad that the C. P.R. is putting the Gibson Branch back where it was when first taken over by that railway in order to trench expenses in other parts of the system. This action the railway authorities evidently think will endure anything in the way of train-service and advantage is being taken of it. The labor of years will be lost if the curtailment is permitted and the intention is to take the matter to the Railway Commission if some change is not made by the railway.

The two Swedes Charles Wiken and Knut Pearson who were arrested by Detective James Roberts for stealing from the blacksmith shop of the Hibbard Co. at the Barony were brought before Col. Marsh this morning and were remanded until tomorrow at 11 o'clock. Mr. P. A. Guthrie for the prisoner stated that several people from the home of the parents had called him up and told him that the men had always been steady fellows and that they were surprised at them committing such an offence.

WOMAN WILL ADDRESS DRY GOODS MEN

New York, Feb. 9--Plans have been completed for the dinner of the National Retail Dry Goods Association which will be given at the Hotel Astor tomorrow night. The dinner will be one of the events of the annual convention of the association, which will assemble tomorrow morning for a two days' session. Mrs. J. Borden Harriman will be one of the principal speakers at the dinner. Mrs. Harriman is the resident commissioner of the Committee on Industrial Relations that was appointed recently by President Wilson.

DETROIT TO VOTE ON CHARTER TOMORROW

Detroit, Mich., Feb. 9--A special election will be held tomorrow for the purpose of determining whether the new charter drawn up for the city of Detroit shall be adopted. The new charter is designed to bring to the city the fruits of municipal home rule. It provides for the lengthening of the terms of office of the mayor and other elective city officials to four years, holding the elections in the spring to keep them free from state and national campaigns, and the choice of officials by means of the non-partisan, preferential ballot. The charter also gives the people the power of recall in case any of the officials fail to deliver satisfactory service.

ROANOKE MINISTER ACCUSED AS WHITE SLAVER

Roanoke, Va., Feb. 10--The case of

Rev. B. F. Landis, the Lutheran minister who was arrested two weeks ago on a charge of violating the Mann White Slave Act, came up for hearing before a Federal commissioner today. Rev. Mr. Landis is accused of having paid the transportation from his home in Prices Fork, Va., to Bluefield, W. Va., of the wife of a neighbor, named Jones. They registered at a Bluefield hotel as brother and sister, remaining several days.
