Igloos of Eskimos Crowded and Un sanitary

The igloos used by the Eskimos of the bleak north are small in size necessarily overcrowded, and every crevice is carefully sealed during the long winter months in order to main tain a comfortable temperature with in. The different forms of dwellings on the Arctic coast are the sod igloos which are the standard and are con structed on two different plans.

The first type of igloo, with windows and doors in the walls, is a frame structure of logs or lumber The walls and roof are covered thickly with sod, and one or two windows are set into the walls. The home contains two separate compartments which are connected by a small door the living-room proper and the entry ler in size than the living quarters and is used as a storeroom for provisions, clothing, sleds, and other articles too numerous to mention. The entrance into the igloo is also con structed of timber, and covered with sod, but the plan of construction differs somewhat from the one just lrops eight bombs on British soil! described. The furniture equipment usually consists of a small stove, a few dishes, and improvised beds. The board floor, which is usually fairly clean, serves the purpose of chairs and tables. A few of the families own sewing machines and occasion ally a phonograph.
