### CANADIAN MANUFACTURERS HAVE GREAT OPPORTUNITY

The object of the following circular and letter, published at the request of the Board of Trade, is to waken the Boards of Trade and all persons interested in trade and commerce to the new situation that is to be met by Canadian manufacturers and merchants, as well as by the public at large, because of the crippling of the gigantic trade of Great Britain's enemies, Austria and Germany.

To the Secretary Fredericton Board  
of Trade,

Dear Sir:—War having been forced upon the Mother Country by the action taken by the German government, the British Imperial Council of Commerce, and Boards of Trade of the British empire, ventures to make an appeal to its constituent bodies in this emergency and to direct their attention to those departments of commerce which are principally affected by the stoppage of the trade hitherto carried on by "enemy" countries and the British empire.

The watchword of the various Com-  
mittees of Chambers of Commerce of the empire has been UNITY IN COM-  
MERCE and UNITY IN DEFENCE and, following on the splendid and spontaneous offers of armed assistance to the Mother Land in her time of trial from all parts of the British empire, it would seem a fitting opportunity to give reality to the first part of the double aspiration, and place our inter-empire trade on a more lasting basis.

We have no reason to be grateful to Germany in the past for the methods by which she has sought to undermine an inter-empire trade in an empire which she did nothing to found, and which she is now doing her best to overthrow, and it would ill become the Chambers of Commerce not to seize the opportunity to repel these attacks and to hold and consolidate our own.

Enclosed will be found tables giving the figures of the trade between Germany and the various dominions of the crown, and it is respectfully suggested that if your Chamber, from its knowledge of the local conditions, would address representations to the secretary of the British Imperial Council of Commerce, indicating the best methods of supplanting this

the main lines in Germany has been suspended for the past four days, according to a Copenhagen despatch to The Daily News, to allow of the transportation, as quickly as possible, to the western field of an army of ninety thousand freshly trained men.

BOTHA TO DEAL WITH REBELS.

London, Oct. 15—A despatch to Reuter's Telegram Company from Cape Town says that General Britz, the officer appointed by General Botha, premier and commander-in-chief of the Union forces, to take over command of the rebel, Lieutenant Colonel Gerhardus Maritz, reports that one of his patrol has engaged a part of Maritz's force at Raledraal, and taken eighty prisoners.

Cape Town, via London, Oct. 15—As a result of Colonel Maritz's rebellion in the northwest of the Cape provinces, General Louis Botha, premier of the Union of South Africa and commander of the troops of the Union, is taking the field earlier than he originally intended to do. General Botha is placing himself at the head of several strong Dutch commandos, organized on the old burgher lines, which are affiliated with regiments trained by the Union defence force.

Commandants, field cornets and burghers who served under General Botha in the South African War, are rallying to his call, irrespective of their political feeling, to fight alongside the English in defence of the empire against which twelve years ago, they were in arms. This fact has had a marked effect on waverers, who are now flocking to General Botha's standard.

The other rebels within the Union, having openly declared themselves, the government considers itself not obliged to deal gently with them, out of consideration for certain Dutch people who, even though they are not strong supporters of the government, are said to have drawn the line at rebellion.

The government, also is adopting stern measures by arresting prominent men who are suspected of sowing sedition, charging them with high treason.

General Hertzog, leader of the opposition, who has been one of General Botha's most bitter opponents, has placed his services at the disposal of the premier.

writes to the Vossische Zeitung:

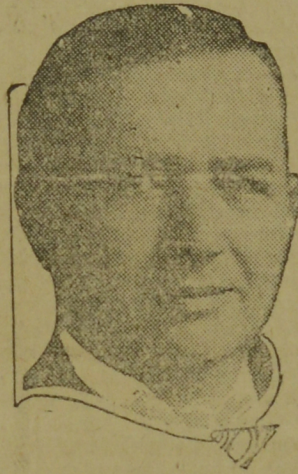
"It is true that our soldiers shot

London, Oct. 16—Reuter's Amster-  
dam correspondent writes:

"The Amsterdam Telegraaf learns  
from its Sluis, Netherlands, corres-  
pondent that fighting has occurred in  
the neighborhood of Bruges."

"After a brief battle near Ursel, ten  
miles southeast of Bruges, the corres-  
pondent says, the Germans opened  
the way to Bruges yesterday. They  
arrived at Bruges and Damme, four  
miles to the northeast of Bruges, this  
morning. They also have appeared  
at Blankenberghe, on the English  
Channel, nine miles northwest of  
Bruges and twelve miles northeast of  
Ostend, and are expected to arrive  
at Ostend today."
