## STOCKS WERE MORE ACTIVE THIS MORNING

New York, May 19.—Market opened a fraction above Monday's closing figures but realizing sales were met on the advance and room traders showed an inclination to work for a reaction, thinking the advance had gone far enough in the absence of new developments.

The Utah Copper Co. produced in April 15,133,770 pounds. Westinghouse was a strong feature and buying was such as to indicate accumulation by large interests in the Company. The buying of Reading and Steel by Kuhn & Loeb account attracted a good deal of attention. Traders looked at it as an indication of a bullish attitude on the part of these interests.

To the rise in Reading which acted in a way to indicate that weak bulls have been shaken out a fairly good response was made by Lehigh, and D. & W. was active to an unusual degree.

Montreal, May 19.—This market was dull but showed strength in many places during the morning session. Brazilian held very steady at 79 showing a fractional gain over Monday's close. Dom. Canners showed strength and activity, opening at 45½ and quickly selling to 46 a net gain of a full point over yesterday. Dom. Steel was dull but steady at 23. Textile held well around 75. Laurentide was dull and strong at 180; Power was dull but showed strength around 222½. Quebec Railway was the feature of the morning, showing at 16 and quickly selling up to 16½, much activity and strength, opening a net gain of more than a point, over yesterday's close. R. & O. was again traded in small lots but was somewhat stronger around 100½. Shawin was dull but showed strength at 133. Toronto St. Rights were traded in freely at 2½.

The market may have small reactions, but we still believe that it should be bought on any soft spots or at present level of prices.

responded Mr. Carvell. "We could get into the fringe at least and we need get into the fringe only to find one of the greatest stock-jobbing transactions in the history of America."

"I object," he continued, "to handing over \$45,000,000 to these men. The money should be handed by the government. That would be risk enough with this government of spend thrifts, but it would be nothing to the risk incurred in handing it over to MacKenzie & Mann."

Mr. Carvell described the bond guarantee given to the C.N.R. by the British Columbia government as outrageous. This province, with a population of less than 500,000, had assumed a debt of \$48,000,000 for a road which paralleled either the C.P.R. or the G.T.P., with the possible exception of 150 miles, where it opened up new territory. The C.N.R. roads in the prairie provinces were no doubt needed, but the British Columbia line was unnecessary and the government was simply taking a load off the shoulders of British Columbia. The government was really assuming the burden of liability amounting to \$400,000,000.

There was no financial transaction in Canada that could compare with it for absolute nonsense and lack of business ability. MacKenzie & Mann who had got \$300,000,000 out of the public, were not willing to put up one cent of their own money.

Hon. W. T. White said the question might be raised as to whether a mistake in policy had not been followed in Canada with regard to railways, if so the past was irrevocable. It was best to accept what was inevitable and to take care that the future was worked out right.

## ADMIRAL DRURY DEAD IN LONDON

Was a Cousin of Dr. T. C. Allen and Mr. E. H. Allen of This City—  
Had a Brilliant Career

A Canadian press cable from London says: "The Death of Admiral Sir Charles Carter Drury occurred today at the age of sixty-eight."

Vice Admiral Sir Charles Carter Drury, K. C. S. I. (1903) K. C. B. (1905) G. C. V. O. (1907) F. R. G. S., was born at Rothesay, N. B. I. on August 27, 1846. He was the second son of Le Baron Drury, and Eliza, daughter of Lieutenant Colonel Jas. Pointz, late commander of the 30th Regiment. He was married in 1886 to Frances Ellen, eldest daughter of Robert Whitehead, of Beckett, Berks and Plumbe, Austria. His wife died in 1900.

Admiral Drury was educated at the Collegiate School Fredericton and entered the royal navy in 1859. He became sub-lieutenant, 1865; lieutenant, 1868; commander, 1878; captain, 1885; rear-admiral, 1899; A. D. C. to the queen 1897-99; naval advisor to inspector general of fortifications 1885-88; flag captain North American and West Indies H. M. S. "Bellorophon" 1889-92; member ordnance committee 1893-94; flag-captain H. M. S. "Royal Sovereign" (Chenel's squadron) 1894-95; H. M. S. "Hood" (Mediterranean) 1896-98; senior officer, Gibraltar, 1898-99; vice-president of the committee in chief Mediterranean, 1907-08; commander-in-chief at the Nile, 1908-11; when he retired from the active list; second naval lord of the Admiralty, 1903-08; represented the royal navy at the Delhi Durbar, 1908.

He had received the following decorations: Legion d'Honneur; Grand Cross of the Order of Merit; (navy) Spain; Grand Cross of the Royal Regiment of the Order of the Redeemer Greece; Grand Cross of the Osmanieh (in brilliants) Turkey; Grand Cross of Austrian Imperial Leopold Order and Cross of the Order of Red Eagle, Germany, received thanks of the British Foreign Office for services in Crete, 1896.

The deceased admiral's wife was a niece of the late Sir John Allen of this city and a cousin of Dr. T. C. Allen K. C. and Mr. E. H. Allen.

ment last session to aid the C.N.R., construction would have ceased and the effect of that on all Canadian securities would have been bad. Had that action not been taken the government would have been blamed today.

Mr. White then took up the matter of the \$7,000,000 of stock secured by the government as security for the loan of \$15,000,000 given last session maintaining that there had been absolutely no deception in regard to the fact that this stock was to come out of capital authorized but not yet issued.

"Did you tell the house that this was to be new stock or a portion of the stock already issued?" asked E. M. MacDonald.

"I certainly did not tell the house that this was to be part of the stock already issued," said Mr. White. He added that it was unjust to MacKenzie & Mann to assert that they had started the printing presses and issued illusory stocks. The government had been perfectly fair in regard to this matter.
