## THE ALLIES CONTINUE

(Continued from page one.)

sessions, that there has been fighting on the borders of the German and Belgian colonies in that continent, and that the British and Germans have been having more skirmishes.

The most serious affair, however, is the rebellion in the Union of South Africa, although Premier Botha, who withheld the news of the rising led by Generals De Wet and Beyers until he himself got into action, seems to have inflicted a severe defeat on General Beyers, completely routing his commando and taking a number of prisoners.

The invasion of Angola was not unexpected, for Portugal has declared her intention of helping the Allies, and in view of the possibility of a German attack on her colonies had sent reinforcements to her garrisons. Portugal, if the report of the German invasion is true, is the ninth nation to be drawn into the war, and there is still danger of others following.

Holland is growing uneasy in the fear that her neutrality may be violated. The mouth of the Scheldt, which the Germans, now that they have Antwerp, would find of much service to them, and the eastern border of the Netherlands, where the Germans are massing troops, are the danger points. The Dutch government declares it is prepared to guard the country's neutrality at any cost.

**BRITISH VESSELS UNHARMED**  
London, Oct. 29.—The correspondent at Dover of the Central News says:

"The British fleet is still operating against the Germans off Belgium with as yet not one vessel being struck. A battleship has now joined in the bombardment, using her 12-inch guns."

**INDIAN TROOPS IN ACTION**

Paris, Oct. 28.—The vigor of the German attacks on the north was diminished greatly today, after they had carried out two surprise assaults during the night which cost both sides dear.

Real successes have been attained by the Allies, who have not only prevented a breach in their lines, but have made considerable progress and now firmly hold the line from Newport to Dixmude, and on to the neighborhood of Lille.

Officers who have returned from the front describe a difficult and dangerous task performed by the native troops during the night along the Belgian coast. They surprised and destroyed a German ammunition park thus putting out of action several German batteries which had caused great annoyance to the Allies, who could not reach them with their artillery.

In absolute darkness several natives crept up stealthily and killed the German sentries. They then set fire to a thicket where the ammunition wagons were sheltered, causing all the shells to explode.

The German lines have been visibly thinned to the south of Lille and St. Quentin and along the lines of trenches leading to the eastern frontier, but in the neighborhood of Craonne and Berry-Au-Bac, on the Aisne, where General Von Kluck is commanding, the German forces are in great strength.

It is believed that the German troops who captured Antwerp are now massed under the Belgian coast, and that additional divisions are assisting them which have been brought from the long front, where the siege has progressed for many weeks.

A recurrence of the German offensive was expected near Craonne, where General Von Kluck started a sharp diversion to test the strength of the Allies' lines, and was thrown back. Further east, in the Argonne region, and on the frontier, severe fighting continues incessantly, as the result of which the French troops are reported to have made constant progress.

some valuable suggestions as to the number of extra pupils to be provided for and the plans for future operations are being considered.

Several applications for positions on the teaching staff were read and referred to the Teachers' Committee, which is composed of Mrs. Clark, Mrs. Cox and Mr. Weddall. Mr. Lemont was formerly a member of the committee but resigned. Some of these applications are for the position of principal of the new school building, and one was for transfer. An application for an increase of salary was laid on the table.

Reports were made from several committees. Mr. Sterling reported the completion of the line fence at the Smythe Street school-house. The chairman reported respecting the purchase of a microscope for the science department.

At a previous meeting Miss Myra L. Sherman, principal of the Morrison Mill school was granted two months' leave of absence. She has since resigned her position. Miss Verna L. Baird was appointed temporary supply and yesterday Miss Baird was appointed to the Mill school for the balance of the term.

An offer to purchase a bargain piano was rejected, although the price asked could not be considered extreme.

The chairman and secretary will see about the necessity for temporary heating of the new school-house.

Several insurance policies about expiring, the secretary was instructed to renew the same in the same companies.

Salaries for the month were ordered paid and after passing a number of bills, the board adjourned.

## ASSAULT CASE

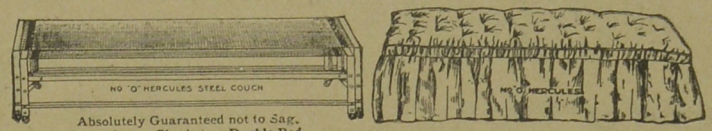

young man, began to twitter and the noise they made finally attracted the attention of the city marshal. Believing Parker to be the disturbing element, he caught hold of him and tried to eject him. Parker made some show of resistance and the marshal allowed him to take another seat and did not further molest him. A little later on the party who had taken Parker's seat was removed from the hall.

Parker, feeling that he had been humiliated and assaulted without cause, laid a charge of assault against the city marshal. The case was tried this morning and seven witnesses testified for the prosecution, and told practically the same story, which was to the effect that the complainant was in no way to blame for the disturbance. The city marshal in his own behalf, stated that he had been given to understand that Parker was the cause of the trouble. The police magistrate found the defendant guilty of assault and imposed a fine of ten dollars and costs. In delivering judgment, His Honor said that there was no evidence to show that the young man had been guilty of a wrongful act and there was no justification for the assault. He thought the conduct of the city marshal should have the attention of the police commission.

The city marshal announced that he would appeal the case.
