HON, C. W. ROBINSON

Hon. Clifford W. Robinson, ex-premier of the province, has been selected to lead the forces of good government to victory in New Brunswick at the next provincial election. The choice was made at a large and representative gathering in this city yesterday, and the people of the province of all shades of politics who believe in an honest administration of public affairs will heartily approve of it. In accepting the position, which is one of great responsibility and importance Hon. Mr. Robinson is actuated by a high sense of duty. Tile thousands of other worthy citizens, he feels that the province has been disgraced and tainted by the shanneful carnival of graft, corruption and extortion carried on under Flemming misrule and drastic measures must be employed if Mr. Robinson has heeded the unanimous call extended to him and will continue the work of cleaning the Augean stables so well begun by Messrs. Carvell and Dugal. The hand of grafters and incompetents now misruling the province and the hold-up men and buccaneers who do their vidling, must be got rid of and if the wonderful enthusiasm displayed at the magnificent reflected even to a small degree public bone heap just as soon as the electors get a whack at them.

Powell, the sitting member. In 1897 he was elected to the legislature for Westmorland at the general elections of 1899, 1903 was not a candidate. He went out of office with his government after its defeat at the polls in the general election of 1908. For three years following he led the opposition in the legislative assembly. He retired from the position of opposition leader in 1911.

Although a lawyer by profession, Hon. Mr. Robinson has had an extensive business training which will stand him in good stead as leader of the government, which sooner or later ion of the portable national capital.
