## JUDGE LANDRY RETURNS.

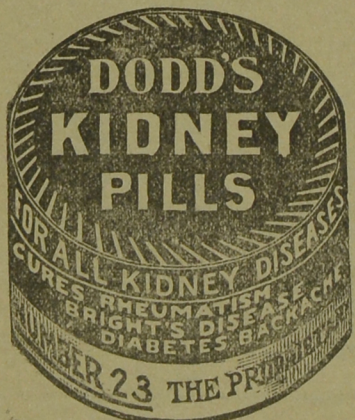

President J. D. Palmer is out of the city at present but other officials of the board are very warm in their statement that the board will take no part in the civic campaign, and such an announcement as that made last night will injure the board. Treasurer James W. Lamont, stated this morning that the story was absolutely without foundation and was published on no authority.

Ex-President J. T. Jennings who is a member of the executive stated that the Board of Trade had always avoided politics of any kind. Its

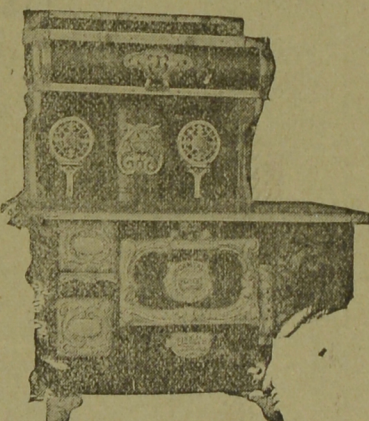

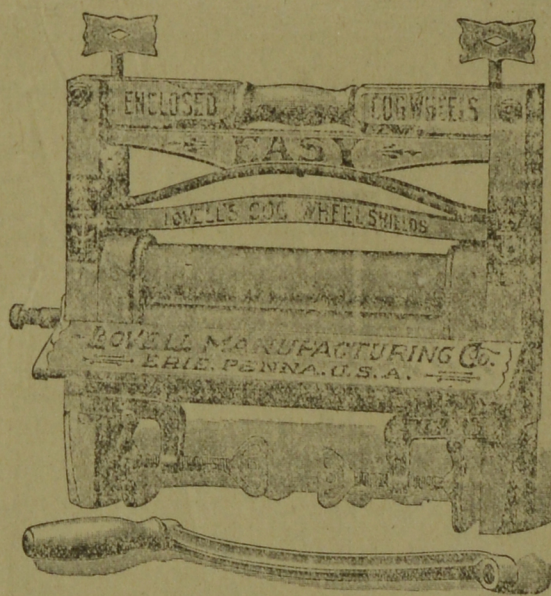
