ALBERTA STOCKMAN IN STRONGER POSITION

Calgary, Alta., April 26.—The live stock dealers in Alberta are now in the advantageous position of being able to play Chicago buyers against those from Seattle. The first evidence of this competition during this year was seen the other day when ten carloads of prime beef cattle were shipped from the Chicago stockyards to Chicago. They will be sold in the United States market next Monday, when it is expected they will bring 8½ cents to 9 cents per pound.

The entire consignment is range-fed stock and seldom have better finished animals passed through the local market. Four carloads, or eighty head, out of the total shipment of two hundred head, weighed on an average of 1,800 pounds per steer. The demand for this heavy, well-finished beef from the larger markets across the line is strong and according to a prominent cattleman in this district, the ten carloads which went east today are but the beginning of a considerable movement of Alberta cattle in that same direction.

Seventy-five thousand head of hogs have gone directly from this one district to Seattle since the beginning of the present year, as well as a large number of cattle. The commencement of the trade with Chicago places the Alberta producer in a strong tactical position. His stock is now sought by the buyers of the local abattoirs, who also supply British Columbia and by the buyers from the Pacific Coast states and from Chicago.

NEW ENGLANDERS START SEASON

Boston, Mass., April 29.—With a circuit that has undergone radical changes since the close of last season, the New England league, one of the oldest baseball organizations in America in point of continuous existence, started on its twenty-fourth season today with all signs pointing towards a profitable year and an interesting race for the pennant. The circuit this year is made up of Lowell, Worcester, Lawrence, Lynn, Portland, Haverhill, Fitchburg and Lewiston, the three last-named clubs having taken the franchises formerly held by Fall River, New Bedford, and Brockton. Three of the clubs are in charge of former major league managers, J. J. Burke at Worcester, Fred Lake at Fitchburg and Hugh Duffy at Portland.

In the opening games today, Haverhill appeared at Lowell, Lewiston at Lawrence, Lynn at Fitchburg and Portland at Worcester. A season of 126 games is scheduled, with September 12 as the closing date.

Gardiner, Me., April 29.—The first India paper ever made in the United States will soon be turned out by one of the paper mills in this city. Heretofore a single firm in England has had the monopoly of the manufacture of India paper. The paper is made of flax and is very fine in texture, very light and very strong. It runs twice as many sheets to the pound as the ordinary book paper and consequently is in much demand for printing large works.

FRANK RE-ELECTED MAYOR OF ST. JOHN

St. John April 29.—The citizens of St. John yesterday chose James H. Frank for Mayor for the next two years by a majority of 596 over H. R. McLellan endorsed Rupert W. Wigmore and James V. Russell as commissioners for four year terms and Frank L. Potts as commissioner for a two year term.

The plebiscite on the matter of asking for legislation to give the municipal franchise to married women owning property was carried by a vote of 3,175 for, to 2,260 against or a majority of 915. This will mean that in the next election 1,400 women will be qualified to vote, provided of course, that their taxes are paid.

As in the primaries, Commissioner Wigmore led the poll by an enormous vote, receiving about seventy per cent of the vote polled and having 2,228 votes more than were necessary to give him a four year term. Mr. Russell had a majority of 327 over Mr. Potts while Commissioner Agar ran the low man on the successful ticket very closely with a margin of only thirty-six votes.

The totals are not official but were made up from returns brought to city hall by deputy returning officers and it is considered unlikely that the official count to be announced at city hall at eleven o'clock today will change the result. G. Fred Fisher was fifth man, eighty-eight votes behind Commissioner Agar while C. W. deForest ran 801 votes behind Mr. Fisher.

Rome, April 28.—Pope Pius today decided to hold a consistory on May 25 for the purpose of creating cardinals. Among those who will be elevated to membership in the Sacred College are:

Mist (Rev. Louis Nazaire Begin, archbishop of Quebec.

Monsignor Guasoa Menendez, archbishop of Toledo, Spain.

Monsignor Serafini, assessor of the Congregation of the Holy Office.

Monsignor J. Delachiesa, archbishop of Bologna.

Monsignor Czernoch, archbishop of Strigonia.

Monsignor Sevin, archbishop of Lyons.

Monsignor de Bettiger, archbishop of Munich.

Monsignor de Garmann, archbishop of Cologne.

Monsignor Pille, archbishop of Vuenana.

Monsignor Giustini, secretary of the Congregation of the Sacraments.

Monsignor Lega, senior judge of the Rota Tribunal.

Monsignor Tacchi, assessor of the Consistorial Congregation.

Abbot Gasquet, president of the English Benedictines.

The long expected list of cardinals to be created at the consistory is causing some surprise as they expected Monsignor Bruchesi, archbishop of Montreal, to be included, while nobody thought Abbot Gasquet would receive the honor, although all agree he is most worthy. It is stated that the decision to hold the consistory was due chiefly to the insistence of Germany, which would otherwise cause a conclave without a representative of the Sacred College. However, evidently, Cardinals Gibbons, Farley and O'Connell knew the consistory would be at the end of May, as all had decided to be in Rome at that time.


