THE STOCK MARKET STILL IN A WAITING MOOD

New York, N.Y., Feb. 20—The market opening was quiet and rather weak. Steel was heavy at 60 but rest with support at that figure. Some traders thought investigation by the grand jury of the disappearance of certain records needed by the government was a factor in the stock. Amalgamated Copper and American Smelting showed declines of 1/2 each. Union Pacific started unchanged and it was contended that there was a large short interest in it. Baltimore & Ohio for January show a gross increase of \$156,806. The January net increase was \$160,947, and the seven months' gross increase was \$82,813.

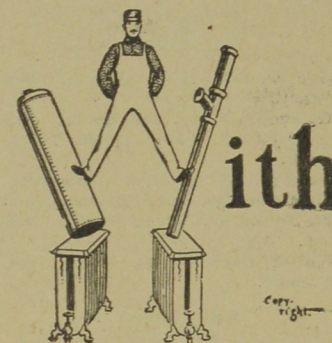
