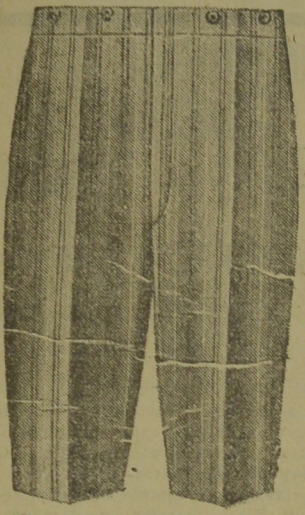

STOCK MARKET REVIEW

Sept. 15—Another week has passed, leaving the stock market in much the same position as it was at the beginning, the peculiar and remarkable condition of the present stock market being that it disregards every kind of news. Politics and the political situation has apparently no effect, no more has the increasing business activity of the country, while but little attention is centered on the monetary situation, though this week has been marked by a considerable increase in the rates for both call and time money.

In the meantime the securities market moves alternately up and down within very narrow limits, and shows no marked tendency in either direction, while the trading continues almost at a minimum.

The most potent factors of the last two weeks have been the Vermont and Maine elections, as these are usually taken to indicate what is likely to occur later on when the presidential election comes off. These elections have been passed and have caused scarcely a ripple in Wall street nor does the prospect, almost certainly in fact, that the Democrats will get into power in November, lend any color.

Crop reports from all sections of the United States and Canada are good, and it is increasingly evident that this current will enjoy the best harvest, taking all crops into consideration, that has been experienced in several years. The reports from the industries too, particularly the Steel trade, are excellent, and though the outlook is for good conditions arising from these facts, in short almost a boom, security prices are almost uninflected.

MONEY.

Firmness is the key note of the money market. Time money has been marked up, and owing to this fact business in time funds is rather slack, while both in the United States and Canada the banks are preparing themselves for a considerable demand which will be necessitated by the movement of the crops.

Money is also firm in Europe.

though there has been no change of importance in the money markets over there during the past week.

In Canada there is a tendency towards slightly higher rates, and the banks find themselves obliged to be less free with their credits than during the summer. This condition, however, will right itself very shortly, through the marketing of the agricultural products, which will provide credits abroad.

MONTREAL.

The Montreal market has moved within narrow limits and the trading element there has confined itself to operating as has been its mode for several months past, in one stock at a time. Our Montreal office provides us with the following advice in regard to several of the most active of the stocks:

DOMINION IRON.

"There have been very small fluctuations in this stock for some time, buying orders from London for small lots being still in evidence and better prices later on are probable."

RICHELIEU & ONTARIO.

"London has been a buyer of this stock since the break to 103. The technical position of the stock is much better than before to break as a block of stock which was over the market was liquidated. The stock is considered a purchase for a turn on all reactions from present prices."

CANADA CAR.

"London regards this stock as a very favorable speculation, a few buying orders from that centre causing an advance of two points. Very little stock is offered and a small demand would materially harden the market."

TORONTO RAILS.

"Although there has been very little trading in this stock this week, we still feel favorably inclined towards it. Its earnings are good and it looks attractive as an eight per cent stock around present prices."
