REQUEST COMPLIED WITH.

In response to a communication from the City Clerk, Supt. William Downie of the C.P.R., has issued instructions that men be sent here to superintend the excavating beneath the C.P.R. tracks on York street for the laying of a larger water-main to supply York and Argyle streets.

TAKEN INTO CONSIDERATION.

A communication has been received by the city from Hon. Frank Cochrane, minister of railways and canals, to the effect that the application of the St. John & Quebec Railway Company for permission to use the tracks of the C.P.R. between Westmorland street and Victoria Mill in this city, had been taken into consideration.

TO EXTEND SEWERAGE.

The City Council at last night's special meeting, decided on the recommendation of Ald. Burchill, chairman of the Water and Sewerage Committee, to extend the sewerage system on York street to serve a number of dwellings south of the Hartt Boot & Shoe Factory. The Board of Health drew attention to this matter a short time ago.

TWO FIRE STATIONS
TO BE ERECTED
NEXT SEASON

City Council Turns Down Proposition to Proceed at Once With Building of New Structure on Central Station Site

The erection of two new fire stations to be erected next year, one near Northumberland street and one near St. John street and the abandonment of the proposition to erect a new central fire station this year on the site of the present station, was what was decided last night at a full meeting of the City Council. Six aldermen favored the two-station scheme brought in by Ald. Calder. Three supported the Fire Committee's scheme for a new central station and Ald. Ryan did not vote. The council took the action it did on the ground that the season is now too late to begin building operations and that the present and expected growth of the city warranted the building of two new fire stations in the East and West Ends.

While the matter was under discussion there were a few passes between Ald. Cruikshank and Ald. Farrell concerning the manner in which the Fire Committee had dealt with the matter of a new station.

The council met as committee of the whole.

Ald. Guthrie moved, seconded by Ald. Cruikshank, that the committee proceed with consideration of tenders for the new building.

EXPLANATION REQUESTED.

Ald. Farrell, who had not been present at the last meeting, asked for an explanation for the taking of the matter out of the hands of the Fire Committee.

His Worship stated that the action had been taken at the request of Ald. Cruikshank, chairman of the Fire Committee, a deadlock having occurred in that committee on the matter of opening tenders.

ALD. FARRELL'S STATEMENT.

Ald. Farrell stated that though present at the meeting of the Fire Committee in question he was not aware that any division had been taken. He was surprised to learn by the press of the city that the chairman of the Fire Committee had stated that a deadlock had occurred.

Ald. O'Neill asked if Ald. Farrell was in order and was told by the chair that he was.

Ald. Farrell continuing, stated that on the occasion to which he referred the committee had talked informally and in a desultory fashion. Its members

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HARRY MYSHRALL
SHOT HIMSELF
THROUGH SHOULDER

Was Showing Revolver to Friend in His Room Early This Afternoon--Weapon Accidentally Discharged--Artery Severed--Taken to Hospital

Harry Myshrall a well known young man boarding at Leonard Brewer's, York Street, accidentally shot himself through the left shoulder early this afternoon with a 32 calibre revolver which he was showing to a friend. An artery in his shoulder was severed by the bullet and Myshrall was rushed to Victoria Public Hospital by ambulance. Dr. G. C. VanWart was summoned to attend the injured man and Dr. McNally assisted him. Myshrall is seriously hurt.

The shooting occurred shortly after one o'clock. Myshrall just finished his dinner. Accompanied by John Brewer son of Mr. Brewer he was in his bedroom. He picked up a new revolver and proceeded to show it to Brewer. One cartridge was in the chamber and exploded when he snapped the trigger the second time.

Myshrall staggered from his room to the dining-room crying "I'm shot! I'm shot!" As soon as it was seen how serious was his injury medical aid was summoned and preparations were made to take him to the hospital.

Harry Myshrall is a son of Frank Myshrall of Kingsclear and is a well known young man. He formerly was travelling representative of J. L. Nichols & Co., Toronto, lithographers and printers. He had resided in Fredericton for some time. Recently he had been away having returned from Sydney only on Saturday last.

EXPECTED TO RECOVER

It was reported from the hospital late this afternoon that Myshrall was resting easily and was expected to recover.

EXPRESS DELIVERY BOUNDS.

The City Clerk has received official advice concerning the bounds set by the Railway Commission for the taking and delivery of express parcels in Fredericton. The eastern and western limits are to be the Ketchum bridge and Odell avenue respectively. The southerly bounds are to be Lansdowne street, the C.P.R. tracks and Victoria street and its prolongation with certain exceptions, the latter being the Chestnut Canoe Factory and the University of New Brunswick. The Exhibition Buildings and the Trotting Park are also to be within the limits, while exhibitions or race meets are in progress.

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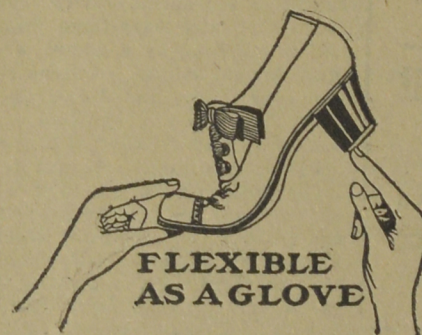
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
