MANY WILL ATTEND  
IMMIGRATION CONFERENCE

(St. John Telegraph)

Booming the immigration confer-  
ence at Fredericton is now part of  
the day's work at the board of trade  
rooms and additional clerical assist-  
ance in handling the large amount of  
advertising matter has been found  
necessary. The promotion of the con-  
ference arranged for an attendance of  
about 700 officially accredited dele-  
gates and all these are being com-  
municated with and reminded of the  
necessity for their being in at-  
tendance. Altogether Secretary An-  
derson estimates that his staff will  
send out more than 2,000 letters in  
the course of the three weeks cam-  
paign.

Each board of trade in the pro-  
vince is being asked to send three  
delegates which means a deputation  
of 66 business men if all respond.  
There are 115 agricultural societies  
in the province and every one is be-  
ing asked to send three delegates,  
making a solid block of 345 farms re-  
presented. The 32 members of the  
New Brunswick Fruit Growers' Asso-  
ciation and the 77 members of the  
Farmers' and Dairymen's Association  
will also be accredited as delegates  
and are being sent notices to attend.

The urban population will be fur-  
ther represented by the mayor and  
one alderman from each town coun-  
cil and the wardens of the fifteen  
county councils are also being urged  
to give the movement their support  
by their presence and advice.

The city government of Fitchburg,  
Mass., requires that only paper bear-  
ing the paper makers' union label  
shall be used by the city officers.

BOURASSA WANTS THE  
NAVAL ACT REPEALED

Montreal, Feb. 2.—In a signed art-  
icle, which occupies a large part of  
the front page of Le Devoir, this af-  
ternoon, Henry Bourassa, the Nation-  
alist chieftain calls on Premier Borden  
to repeal the Laurier naval law and  
takes him to task for not having  
taken the matter up before now.

His argument is that Lord Beres-  
ford in his book The Betrayal, has  
declared the British navy to be in a  
badly disorganized condition, and  
therefore the Canadian people should  
not have anything to do with it. He  
says the only course to be followed is  
the repeal of the law.

"Why does the federal government  
and the majority which supports it  
hesitate to repeal this law?" he con-  
cludes.

"The election of the premier him-  
self, the verdict of September 21 last  
condemned the naval law no less than  
the reciprocity decree. If the treaty  
had been signed would the govern-  
ment have hesitated in demanding its  
annulment? What does it fear then  
in repealing this absurd law which no  
one wants—sincere imperialists no  
more than ardent Nationalists."

vaudeville.

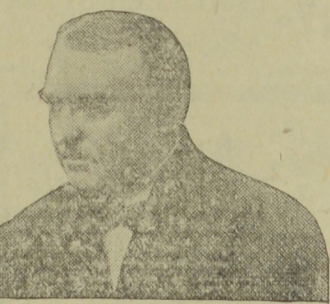
"The Typhoon," the unusual drama
