NO PATIENTS FOR DISTRICT
NURSE

The citizens of Fredericton do not fall over one another in seeking the services of the District nurse. While in some places a movement of this character has been eagerly sought after, in Fredericton the skilful young ladies with well equipped outfit are not in demand up to the present time. In an agreement with the city clergymen and certain bands of organized ladies the Trustees provided a capable nurse for the work, but for some weeks past the nurse has not had a single patient to whom to minister. A conference between the parties interested will shortly be held to decide whether or not the movement will be abandoned.

CHANGES AMONG PHYSICIANS

Several communications were read from Dr. C. P. Holden, Secretary of the Medical Staff, and these received consideration and were approved by the Trustees. The officers of the staff for 1913 will be Dr. Atherton, chairman and Dr. Holden re-elected secretary. The present year Dr. Van-Allen is the chairman. Beginning with next year Dr. B. M. Mullin will succeed Dr. McGrath as medical Trustee. This position holds for two years and the members of the staff succeed each other according to seniority a plan for hospital visitation by members of the staff was also approved.

LECTURES TO STUDENT-NURSES

The success of the graduates of the Fredericton hospital is due to the very efficient medical staff and the deep interest they take in the institution. A course of lectures is given to the student-nurses every year from the 1st of October until the last of May. The course now in progress is—October—Anatomy, Analysis, Dr. McGrath.

November—Physiology, Dr. Holden. December—Materia medica poisons and antidotes, Dr. Mullin.

January—Preparations of patient for operation, post operative treatment, anaesthetics, instruments, Dr. Atherton.

February—Medicine and infectious diseases, Dr. Crockett.

March—Hygiene, bandaging, Dr. Mullin.

April—Surgery, eye and ear, Dr. VanWart.

May—Obstetrics diseases of children Dr. Weaver.

October to May—Cooking for the sick, nursing etiquette, etc., The Matron.

MONTENEGRO DECLARED WAR AGAINST TURKEY

troops on board a large number of Greek vessels which they had seized in Turkish waters and it is understood that these are to be used for the transport of troops.

Paris, Oct. 7.—The tension in the Balkan situation, it is thought tonight at the foreign office and among diplomats, shows a slight slackening. It is a hard fact, however, that the danger from martial enthusiasm remains, and it is realized that the crisis will persist as long as a million troops, spoiling for a fight, continue under arms.

Over optimism, therefore, is discouraged, but it is pointed out that Russia and Austria when really united can go far in the Balkan states. There appears to be solid ground for the belief that the governments both of Turkey and the Balkan coalition—though not necessarily their peoples—are still amenable to pressure from the European powers.

The combined ultimatum demanding reforms, which the Balkan states were to have dispatched to Turkey, has now, under the guidance of diplomacy taken the form of a note which will be sent simultaneously to all the great powers and Turkey, and the Ottoman government which protested that it would not listen to proposals touching on its internal affairs from any source, has itself opened the door to receive the demands the powers intend to make by voluntarily granting the Christian vilayets a wholesale measure of reforms.

BULGARIANS HOT FOR WAR

Official France has noted these signs of concession as hopeful. The government thinks that, with some extension and an adequate guarantee that the powers themselves will take in hand their accomplishments, these reforms ought to satisfy even Bulgaria.

It is believed that Serbia, Greece and Montenegro can easily be induced to accept, but there is not the same confidence that the Bulgarian government will be able to control the war fever which has clutched the people of that country.

Threats already are heard that King Ferdinand will visit the crown if he shows signs of weakening. He remarked on an occasion previous to the upheaval: "I shall maintain peace as long as I can without exposing myself to the stab of a knife."

Recognition of the fact that danger threatens the King of Bulgaria is now proving a check on the optimism to which diplomats would otherwise be inclined to give rein.

London, Oct. 8.—It is officially announced in Constantinople that diplomatic relations between Turkey and Montenegro have been broken off, according to a despatch from the Turkish capital.

Constantinople, Oct. 7.—Turkish troubles have been placed on board all the Greek vessels in Turkish waters which have been seized by the Ottoman government.

The Greek legation here has ordered the Masters of the vessels to land the crews.

Belgrade, Oct. 8.—M. Plamenatz the Montenegrin charge d'affaires at Constantinople has been ordered to leave there today.

The Turkish Charge d'affaires here has been handed his passports by the Montenegrin government. Constantinople Oct. 8.—Receid Pasha since his return from Ouchy Switzerland, states that he succeeded in bringing about an understanding between the delegates of Turkey and Italy on one of the principal points in the peace negotiations. The settlement of the whole question he said could be expected in a few days.
