MUNITIONS BEING SENT TO EUROPE

(New York Herald.)

Exports of war materials alone from the United States now average more than \$1,000,000 a day, according to the foreign trade department of the National City Bank.

In the week ended October 23 last exports of all kinds, including war supplies from the port of New York, amounted to \$67,580,906 or more than three times the total for the corresponding week last year and a high level never before attained. In the same week exports for the entire country were almost \$100,000,000.

Since the war in Europe started exports of horses aggregate \$100,000,000 in value and those of mules nearly \$25,000,000. The number of horses exported is a little less than one-half million and of mules about 100,000.

With coal selling in Italy at more than \$30 a ton, attention is drawn to the fact that the United States is sending more coal to that country than to any other country except Canada. The quantity exported to Italy in the first eight months of 1915 was more than in the entire eight years prior to 1915.

Coal movements to Argentina, Brazil and Uruguay also show large increases in the current year, the total to those three countries in the eight months ended with August being 1,286,000 tons, as compared with 350,000 tons in the corresponding months of 1914 and 254,000 in the corresponding months of 1913.

Largely because of the elimination of German shipping from the high seas the exports from the United

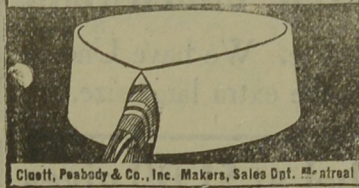

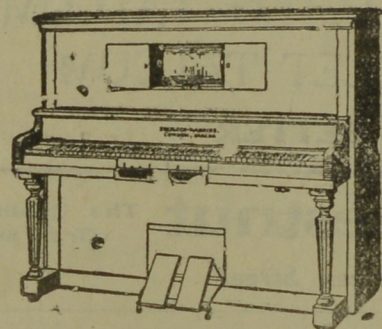
