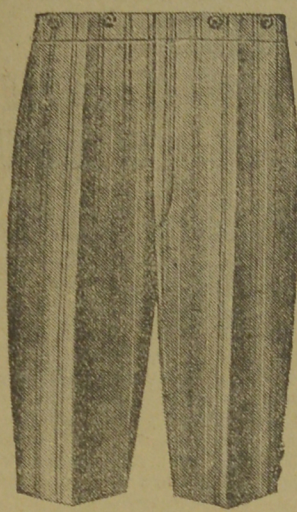

J. M. ROBINSON & SONS WEEKLY STOCK MARKET REVIEW

St. John, Sept. 20—This week's market has strengthened quite considerably after the little flurry in money of ten days ago. The advance in the money rates have been taken philosophically, and prices have recovered from the slight setback which they had at that time and the trend appears to be upward.

In Canada the tightness in the reluctance of the Banks to lend any money. Rates remain practically as they did in the summer and are likely to advance a trifle during the fall with money somewhat hard to obtain.

Textile. This stock has been very active this week and shows a gain of seven points due to the fact that a lot of stock has been taken over from London interests and on rumors

that the stock is to be placed on a 6 per cent. basis. If this proves to be true the stock still looks attractive at present prices.

Detroit. We look for higher prices in stock and we are of the opinion it will be put on a 6 per cent. basis inside of a year. Their earnings are good and we believe that their troubles with the city will be adjusted sooner or later.

Soo earnings are excellent and with the large crops their earnings should continue to show increases. 160 is talked for the stock. It is a purchase on all reactions from the present level.

Montreal Power advances very easily on any buying. While it does not pay a very high rate of interest, at the present price people seem to be willing to buy it on all reactions.

NEW ARGUMENT ORDERED

An application was made by Judge Barry to set this judgment aside. He refused the motion and from his decision the defendant appealed. The full court sustained the appeal. Judge McKeown delivering the judgment, holding that as by the bailable process served upon defendant, he was not summoned to appear in the action and had not entered an application or put in special bail the plaintiff had no right to proceed to judgment against him.

It was also held that a prior application to a judge at chambers to set aside the suit on another ground was not a "step in the cause" and the defendant was not prevented by it from making the motion.

The judgment against the defendant was therefore set aside with costs of the motion before Judge Barry and costs of appeal to the defendant.

Mr. J. D. Phinney, K.C., supported the appeal. Mr. R. B. Hanson contra.

EX PARTE DERPSIER

In the case, Ex parte Derpsier vs. The Board of Liquor Licence Commissioners for the County of Madawaska, Judge Barry had granted an order nisi for a prohibition sustaining the liquor commissioners from issuing licenses, wholesale and retail, to a number of applicants in the county of Madawaska, on the ground that it did not appear that they had set forth in their petitions the necessary allegations and proof required by the Liquor License Act or complied with the other prescribed preliminaries, and that the board was authorized under the act in proportion to the population of Madawaska.

The court, Judge McLeod delivering the judgment, made absolute the order for prohibition restraining the board from issuing the licenses.

Mr. J. D. Phinney, K.C., supported the motion on behalf of the applicant. Mr. A. B. Connell, K.C., contra on behalf of the license commissioners.
