**NEGOTIATIONS FOR  
PEACE NOW PROCEEDING**

London, Nov. 21—The negotiations  
for an armistice between the Bulgarian  
and Turkish armies are now pro-  
ceeding. The generals of the opposing  
forces are discussing terms while  
the armies stand at ease. They oc-  
cupy practically the same positions  
as they did at the time of the great  
battle along the Tchatalja lines for  
the defence of Constantinople opened  
on Saturday night.

Nothing yet has leaked out as the  
course of the negotiations but it is  
expected in official circles here that  
something definite will be known  
later today. From available  
information as to the prevailing feel-  
ing in Constantinople it is anticipat-  
ed that the terms forced by the allied  
Lalkan nations will have to be  
harsher than they are believed to be  
in order to cause the Turkish plen-  
ipotentiaries to reject them.

From Sofia comes the report through  
the semi-official agency at Vienna  
that the terms offered to Turkey are  
not uncompromising either in form  
or substance that they even leave the  
door open to modification. It is  
thought here, that this is likely to  
turn out to be correct as in view  
of the prestige prevailing on the  
main battlefield, the allied nations  
must be keenly anxious to remove  
their troops from contact with the  
devastating scourge.

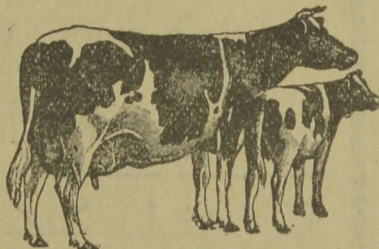
