CANADA WANTS

NO PRO-GERMANS

(New York Herald).

That German-Americans are regarded as personae non gratae in Canada came to light yesterday when Mr. Eugene H. Meyer, a lawyer in Newark, related that he is preparing papers in a damage action against the Delaware, Lackawanna and Western Railroad because the company's ticket agent at the Broad street station in Newark refused to sell a ticket to Detroit to Mr. John Koller, of No. 12 Buffington street that city, vice president of the American Coal Chute Company and Architectural Iron Works.

The agent took Mr. Koller to be a German and gave as the ground that a rule of the company forbade the sale of transportation to a foreigner that would carry him through

Provision May be Made For
Purchase on Expiration
Of Extension.

The special committee of the Fredericton Park Association appointed to negotiate with the Odell Estate for a renewal of the lease of the trotting park has been successful in securing an extension of the lease for a period of two years. The expiration of the lease takes place in August, so the Fredericton Trotting Park will be secure for horse-racing until August, 1917.

An attempt will be made to provide for the purchase of the property on the expiration of the extension. The intention is to provide Fredericton with a park for baseball and other athletics, the city at present being without one. Such a park could be provided within the half-mile track.

"On account of the European war the Canadian authorities are exercising great diligence to prevent foreigners who are not friendly to England from entering Canada, subjecting all foreigners to rigid inspection. Foreigners destined to points in Canada, therefore, should be ticketed to Suspens on Bridge or Bridgeburg only, and foreigners destined to points in the United States should in all cases be routed via lines which will not take them through Canada, unless such foreigners are British or French subjects."

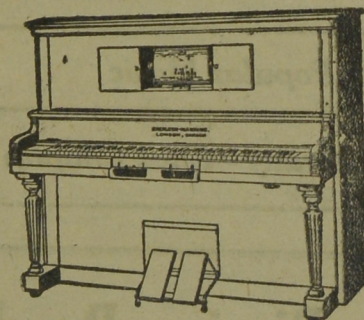
