Even these five districts comprising Constantinople, Adrianople, Saloniki, Monastir and Scutari are seriously menaced. It is reportoniki has been evaculated and that the Turkish army stationed in the city has been withdrawn but confirmation of this has not yet been raceived. Which direction the retreating army is supposed to have taken was not mentioned in the report, but if it is true that the Turks have abandoned the city, they must sooner or later come into contact with one of the armies in vesting the fortress which ever way they take.

Monastir, also where, Fethi Pasha has a large Turkish army under him, is said to have been occupied by the allied Balkan troops but this report acks confirmation.
