J. M. ROBINSON & SONS WEEKLY STOCK MARKET REVIEW

St. John, Nov. 9.—The extremely decisive character of the presidential election has cleared up for the time being at least one of the most influential uncertainties which have been hanging over the situation for a long time. The president-elect has received mandate from the people of a most pronounced character which, in view of the fact that probably both branches of the government will be of the same complexion as his own, gives him a free hand to carry out the policies he has so strongly advocated with very little chance of interference or blocking.

It is to be hoped that the country may have a respite from legislation for many months to come, but this depends entirely on whether an extra session of congress is called, in which event, politics, tariff and trust legislation will be once more brought into the limelight.

The war on the continent has entered the diplomatic and what might be considered most dangerous stage of its development, and will bear extremely close watching as a market influence. We are hopeful that the powers may find it expedient to bury their differences and accept terms preventive of complications of a serious sort.

Eliminating these two foregoing features, the general situation is one of decided hopefulness. Business is good; fundamentals are sound; speculation has been held in check; the market has been burdened with stocks and has the advantage of some short interest; the country is ripe for an era of marked prosperity.

MONTREAL MARKET

It is rather difficult to say very much about the situation of affairs in Montreal just at present as the market has worked into a rut, and will in all probability stay there until such time as the banks see fit to loosen up their purse strings.

There is money to loan for the ordinary requirements of day-to-day business but applications for large loans are not met with open arms.

There is no one who will deny the probability of an active and advancing market as soon as this condition of financial affairs becomes adjusted, and we would advise all interested in Canadian securities to be on the alert for any announcement of easier money.

Among the stocks which can be bought and held for higher prices, the ones which seem to offer the greatest opportunity for an advance without any great risk of a large decline are: Detroit United, Dominion Steel, Dominion Textile, Nova Scotia Steel, Price Bros., Fenman's, Ltd., Richelieu and Ontario, Toronto Railway.

It may be that of these stocks bought now may have a small reaction, and the purchaser may find an opportunity presenting itself to buy at lower figures. This, however, is something which cannot be relied on. What can be relied on is that within a reasonable time the level of prices will be considerably higher than it is today, and the ones who have purchased at the low level will be the ones who will make the big profits.

BULGARIANS ARE RAPIDLY CLOSING IN ON ADRIANOPOLE

The Bulgarian third army has penetrated far into the forest regions south of Derkhos Lake, preparatory to the advance on Constantinople, while the first army is engaged against the main Turkish position east of Tchatalja. This position is not yet completely pierced, but the end of the Turkish resistance appears to be in sight.

The raw Turkish troops large numbers of which were rushed out from Constantinople to meet the enemy's advance are fighting strongly but the exhausted veterans of the early battles are offering little resistance.

Vienna, Nov. 8.—The Reichspost correspondent says that the Turkish troops have been repulsed from the principal points of the Tchatalja lines, the fall of which is expected immediately.

The Turkish advance posts on the right wing opposite the fort of Deliyunus have been captured already by the Bulgarian troops belonging to the third column and these form excellent bases for pushing home attacks on the other lines.

According to information received from prisoners, he adds the typhus has broken out in Adrianople and is causing great devastation among the defending forces. There are already several thousand cases of sickness and horrible tales are heard of the trouble arising from the lack of doctors in the besieged city.

In spite of numerous losses there are still from forty thousand to fifty thousand men engaged in the defence of the city, and although there are several Turkish leaders in the city there is not a single doctor who has received a European education. Although the Turks are very strong and habituated to privation, however, and illness, the disease is doing more damage than is the enemy.

The commander of the Bulgarian investing force is fixing his attention on the complete encircling of the city and he does not contemplate making a forced conquest of the fortress.

GREEKS CAPTURE SALONIKI.

Athens, Nov. 8.—The Greek army, commanded by Crown Prince Constantine, occupied Saloniki, the Turkish stronghold in southwestern Turkey in Europe, today.

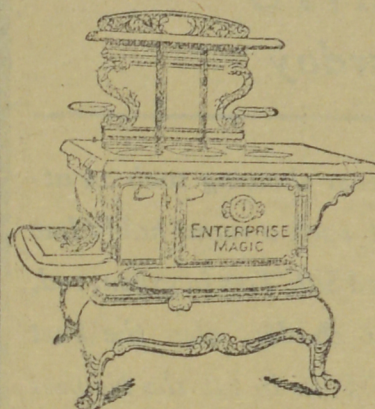
