MR. COPP'S POLICY AND THE FORWARD MOVEMENT

(St. John Times)

What will it mean to the province of New Brunswick to replace the present government at Fredericton by another led by Mr. A. B. Copp?

It would mean the beginning of a new era of progress and development. The platform which Mr. Copp has submitted presents the broadest and most comprehensive policy that has been submitted to the people of this province for many years. He does not propose that the government, if he is its leader, shall be inactive while the people throughout the province are doing all in their power to develop a great forward movement.

When the St. John Board of Trade invited the editors of all the newspapers in the province, of all political parties, to attend a conference in St. John to discuss a forward movement, the universal expression of opinion on the part of the newspaper men was that the first step to be taken should be one which would lead to an increase in population and wealth in the rural communities. Mr. Copp's policy would have this very result. He would place within reach of the farmers cheaper money to enable them to enlarge their operations and carry on their work under more favorable conditions. He would have them provided with a cheap rural telephone service, which would enable them to overcome the sense of isolation and keep themselves also in touch with the markets for their products. He would also pursue a policy which would provide them with better roads, which would be of enormous benefit to the province, but would give them pleasure as well as greater ease in hauling their products to market and bringing back their supplies.

But as the Times has already pointed out, Mr. Copp's policy with regard to the crown lands is also of the very first importance and should be heartily endorsed by the people. But for the revenue from the crown lands this province would be reduced to direct taxation, on an infinitely larger scale than at present; for even now it is necessary to impose direct taxes to meet the ordinary expenditure. It is therefore, a very serious matter to have a government which allows the crown lands to be skinned, and goes on without making any effort to find out the actual extent and value of these lands. No business man would for a moment think of pursuing such a course in connection with his own property. He would want to know its exact extent and value, and govern himself accordingly. Mr. Copp proposes to apply business methods in relation to this great provincial asset.

These three planks in Mr. Copp's platform alone justify the electors in giving him their support, in order that he may be given an opportunity to carry out this policy.

There is again the question of water power. The people are aware that the government forced through the legislature at the last session a bill providing for damming the St. John River and giving to a company extraordinary powers. The whole policy of the Fleming government in regard to corporations and public franchises has been such that one former active supporter, Mr. W. Frank Hatheway, could no longer give it his approval. Mr. Copp, in dealing with such matters, would regard the public interest first, and that of the corporations afterward. Therefore he deserves the support of the people whose interests this government is so ready to sacrifice.

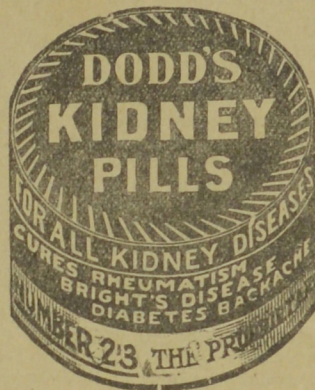
There are other planks in Mr. Copp's platform which commend themselves to thinking men who desire to see the province go forward on the path of progress and prosper-

ity. If the people should return the Fleming government to power they would be giving the premier and his colleagues the assurance that progress is not desired, but the expression of feeling that is given in all parts of the province indicates that on June 20th the verdict of the people will be in favor of the policy outlined in the manifesto of Mr. Copp.
