SOME ELECTION ODDITIES

Washington, D. C., Oct. 28.—According to figures gathered by the Bureau of Statistics, upwards of 15,000,000 citizens of the United States will record their votes for president in the election one week from tomorrow. A total of about 1,400,000 women in the states of California, Colorado, Idaho, Washington, Utah and Wyoming, are eligible to vote.

By no means all the men of twenty-one in the country are qualified voters, for the varying laws of the states not only bar convicts in the prisons in most cases, but place other restrictions on suffrage that become exceedingly important in presidential years.

As nearly every state bars convicts from voting and there are about 150,000 convicts in the prisons of the country, election day will mean nothing to a whole army of them.

Nearly all of the states penalize idleness, insanity and felony by taking away the voting privilege. In addition, a number of the states bar delinquent taxpayers from the right of suffrage.

United States soldiers, sailors and marines are not qualified to vote in Arkansas, Iowa, South Dakota, Tex., and New Mexico.

Florida and Wisconsin place a ban on "duellists" and Idaho and Mississippi deny the right of voting to bigamists and polygamists. A voter in Wyoming must be able to read the state constitution in the English language. In Maine, Michigan, Montana, South Dakota and Washington special restrictions are placed on the voting privileges of Indians.

CANADA'S DAY OF THANKSGIVING

Toronto, Ont., Oct. 28.—Toronto, together with all other cities and towns throughout Canada, today observed Thanksgiving Day. Business was largely suspended and a holiday aspect was generally in evidence. Numerous athletic and sporting events featured the celebrations in the larger cities.

CARLETON COUNTY BOY WRITES FROM AROOSTOOK

To the Editor of the Sentinel:

I was interested in a letter in a recent issue of the "Sentinel" from "Up Aroostook." The writer certainly hit the nail on the head when he stated that he would remain in Carleton Co., if the farmers were in a position to pay reasonable wages.

I have been here about four weeks and expect to get another \$100.00 in addition to my end of which time I will have board. My labor has been in the potato fields only. The farmers are not getting a big price for their potatoes, in some cases at the first of the season only 80c. a barrel, but they can sell them and KNOW they can and KNOW they have the market and KNOWING this raise the quantity.

If the farmers in Carleton Co., were sure of a market what would prevent them from doing the same thing? There is money in potatoes at \$1.00 a barrel provided they can be sold and the farmer has the assurance that he can dispose of his crop.

I worked in McElroy's mill for \$1.50 per day nearly all summer and I might add that if the duty at \$1.25 per thousand had been removed from lumber McElroy's could have paid better wages, as it is now I will earn as much in my five weeks up in Aroostook as I earned in the mill all summer, simply because the farmer has a market for his crop, and both farmer and lumbermen in Carleton Co., could have the same markets and pay the same wages to their laboring men if they would wake up to the fact that broader markets are what is needed.

FIRST POLISH-AMERICAN COLLEGE

Cambridge Springs, Pa., Oct. 25.—With President Taft as the guest of honor, the Polish National Alliance College, the first institution to be established wholly for the education of the Polish youth in America, was formally dedicated here today with interesting ceremonies. The dedication was made the occasion for a great demonstration of the Polish National Alliance, which has established the college and undertaken its maintenance. Large delegations representing the local branches of the Alliance in Milwaukee, Chicago, Pittsburgh, Boston, St. Louis, Toledo, South Bend and numerous other cities attended the ceremonies.

The main building of the new college was formerly an immense summer hotel, which was purchased by the Polish organization for \$250,000. The institution is to be conducted along the lines of first-class American colleges, with the exception that particular attention will be given to Polish literature and history. It is to be a college for the sons of workmen from all parts of the United States whose means would not permit higher education and which in this institution will be furnished at a cost of less than \$10 for tuition, board and room.
