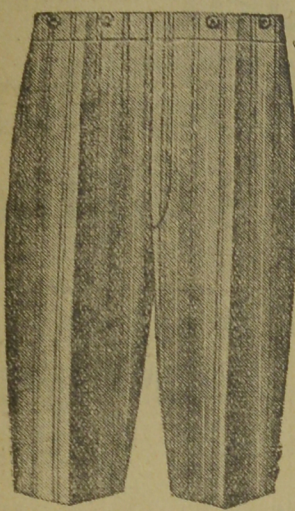

METHODIST PREACHERS
SCARCE IN ENGLAND

Toronto, Sept. 7.—The Rev. Dr. Carman and the other Methodist General Conference officers have had a crisis precipitated upon them by the receipt of a cablegram from the Rev. Dr. Woodworth, who two months ago was sent to England to recruit a hundred preachers from the Theological Colleges for the work in the west, the Canadian supply being completely exhausted, announcing that he had been scarcely able to secure a score of men. An emergency meeting of the Methodist Home Mission executive will be held as soon as possible after Dr. Woodworth's arrival home to deal with the situation caused by the failure of his mission.

MILKED COWS BY
HYDRO-ELECTRIC

Berlin, Ont., Sept. 7.—Hon. Adam Beck, minister of power, assisted in solving the hired help problem in a practical manner at the Hydro-electric Power Commission's demonstration at the farm of John Schaefer, two miles west of Berlin, yesterday afternoon. Owing to the farmers being exceptionally busy in the fields hauling in the grain there was a scarcity of help necessary for thrashing the oats. The minister voluntarily offered to take a hand climbed to the top of the oat sheaves in a large barn, and spent several hours in the terrific heat throwing down sheaves to the mouth of the thrashing machine.

A large number of farmers were present to watch the demonstration. In addition to thrashing several hundred bushels of oats, cows were milked, butter was churned, dinner and supper was cooked by electric power and the entire demonstration was an immense success.

Hon. Mr. Beck informally explained the purpose of the commission in making a tour of the agricultural districts of the province where the transmission lines are located, and intimated that already quite a number of petitions have been received asking for power. He stated that vide equipment at the lowest possible rates, and was confident that the farmers will be able to secure power to operate every department of the farm for \$100 per year.

CANADA'S
FINANCES
BUOYANT

Ottawa, Sept. 7.—The Dominion financial statement for Aug. out today shows continued evidences of gratifying growth in revenue. The total for the month was \$11,445,849 an increase of three millions over the corresponding period last year. For the five months ended with August the aggregate was \$66,903,167 an increase of \$14,009,003 expenditure on consolidated revenue for the five months was \$35,251,137, an increase of \$5,000,000.

In August \$3,953,065 was spent. Outlays chargeable to capital in the five months totalled \$3,701,167 a decrease of \$280,000. The August expenditure on capital was \$1,803,811. Between July and August the public debt was decreased by \$3,097,926. The net debt is now \$519,013,099. Decrease of eight millions compared with a year ago.

CHATHAM HAS A
BIG SENSATION

Chatham, N. B., Sept. 8.—The news of the arrest of Dr. T. I. Byrne, one of the most prominent physicians of the county, a former mayor of the town and a candidate for nomination at a party convention in the last federal general election, on a most serious and revolting criminal charge, became public today and caused one of the greatest sensations in the history of Chatham.

The charge is that of attempted assault on the twelve-year-old daughter of a well known and highly respected citizen of the town.

The alleged offence is said to have been attempted on Thursday. The child told her parents and the warrant for Dr. Byrne's arrest was sworn out that night. The latter was thought to have left town but on Saturday night Chief of Police Peter Coughlan, who had been watching the doctor's residence at the corner of St. John and Wellington Streets, entered the house and found him. He at once placed him under arrest and brought him before Magistrate Cornors. Bail was given for \$2,000, J. L. Stewart and Joseph Grogan each subscribing to bonds of \$1,000 and the doctor was allowed his freedom. A date has been set by the magistrate and the defendant will have to appear for preliminary examination before him.

WOODSTOCK MAY BE
A DIVISIONAL POINT

Woodstock, Sept. 7.—The town council met last night to deal with the right of way of the St. John & Quebec Railway.

A letter from Ross Thompson, chief engineer of the St. John & Quebec Railway, was read, with a statement of prices the company was willing to pay for different properties required by the railway.

He would want the town to reimburse the company for the amount expended when the divisional point was established. The letter contained no mention of the establishment of shops.

There is a feeling that it is a mistake to enter into an agreement until the whole matter is brought to a head, and more definite plans furnished by the railway company as to what they propose to do, and whether it is the intention to establish repair shops in addition to divisional point.

A resolution was moved to this effect and will be discussed at a special meeting Monday morning.

TO INSPECT INDUSTRIAL PLANTS

New York, Sept. 7.—The congress of the International Association for Testing Materials, which has been in session here all week, concluded its business today. Tomorrow the foreign delegates accompanied by some of the American members, will travel by special train to Washington, where they will inspect the government testing laboratories. The same train will take the members to Pittsburgh, where they will witness demonstrations at the experiment station of the bureau of mines, and will visit the coal mines, the steel and cement mills and the electro-technical factories. The members will then go to Buffalo and Niagara Falls, and from there back to New York, after inspecting the works of the Bethlehem Steel Company on the way.

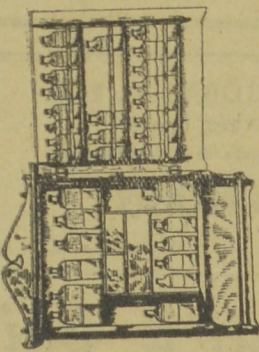
