FAILED TO PLACE WREATH ON GRAVE

Kingston, Ont., June 15.—It has developed that the Kingston Conservative Association did not decorate Sir John A. Macdonald's grave on June 5th after all, although it got the credit of doing so.

To clear up a misapprehension the Cataract Cemetery Company desire this to be known, as people who were about the cemetery on the following days could not find any flowers on the grave and it was thought that the wreath had been stolen. If this had been the case it would follow that other people would be afraid that flowers deposited on the graves of their friends might also be taken. This is the first time since 1891 that the great statesman's grave has been neglected by the Kingston Conservatives, many of whom thought it had been decorated.

SOME VALUABLE HINTS IN REGARD TO VOTING

Each elector shall be entitled to vote only at the polling station of the polling district upon the life of voters for which his name is entered as such voter, and at no other.

Before any vote is taken, the presiding officer and clerk shall open the ballot box, and in the presence of the candidates, their agents and the electors then present, openly and publicly examine the same, and ascertain that it is empty.

Before any elector is permitted to vote, he shall state his name and residence; the clerk shall, under the direction of the presiding officer, enter his name on the check list, and the presiding officer must find it on the copy of the voters' list, mark it, and be satisfied that his vote is single, and deposit the same in the ballot box without reading it. Every ballot shall have the names of the persons voted for written or printed on white paper. The officer presiding at any poll shall state the names of the candidates to any elector requiring it, who is about to vote.

The names of all or any number of candidates at an election may be written or printed upon the ballot paper, and the voter shall mark through or strike out the names of all except the name of the candidate or names of the candidates for whom he wishes to vote, and the ballot so marked, if otherwise good and valid, shall be counted. If there are more names not marked through or struck out than there are members to be elected, the ballot shall not be counted.

In addition to the deputy returning officer and the poll clerk, the candidates and their agents, not exceeding one in number for each candidate in each polling station, and in the absence of agents, one elector to represent each candidate, on the request of said elector, and no others shall be permitted to remain in the room during the time the poll remains open; provided always, that any agent bearing a written authorization from the candidate shall always be entitled to represent such candidate in preference to and to the exclusion of any elector who might also claim the right to represent such candidate; and further provided that in any election when the number of candidates nominated does not ex-


