Louisville, Ky., May 10—The spring meeting of the New Louisville Jockey Club will be ushered in at Churchill Downs tomorrow afternoon with the Kentucky Derby, which now stands virtually alone as the sole survivor of the great classics of the American turf. It will be the thirty-eighth renewal of this rich event, which, as usual, will be worth \$7,000 to the winner. With Worth, Presumption, Sonoda and other of the best three-year-old colts that Kentucky can produce among the probable starters, it appears certain that the field will be one of the classics in the long history of the great event. With a clear day and with the going dry it is predicted by horsemen that the 2:05 Meridian scored when he won last spring will be beaten by the winner in the big race tomorrow.

HAL CHASE IN HOSPITAL

New York, May 9—A statement made public here regarding the condition of Hal Chase, the star first baseman of the New York Americans shows that he is in a sanatorium in this city, being treated for a serious form of stomach trouble. Hopes are still expressed, however, that he will recover in a short time and rejoin the team.

Chase was taken ill in Washington last week and returned to his home in this city.

BASEBALL GAMBLING TO BE STAMPED OUT

New York, May 7—Reports that Book Makers and Gamblers have been operating heavily at the Big League baseball parks here, and in other cities, has stirred New York Club owners to an investigation, every trace of the gambling is to be stamped out, it is announced, in a determined effort to save baseball from the stigma which crushed out horse-racing in the United States.

The club owners have been assured of hearty support in any action they take against the gamblers.

According to newspaper investigators, thousands of dollars are being wagered here daily on the results of the big league games, most of it being ventured through pools for which tickets may be purchased at a price as low as twenty-five cents.

Hundreds of these pools are being operated from Saloons and Cigar stores in various sections of New York and Brooklyn.

HANS LOBERT OUT OF GAME

Reports from Philadelphia have it that Hans Lobert may be out of the game all season. An X-ray examination of the knee that was injured on the Polo Grounds last Saturday showed that the kneecap had been badly fractured, so badly that he will very likely be unable to play again this season. On his arrival in Philadelphia, Lobert was hurried to the St. Joseph Hospital, where Dr. John A. Boyer discovered the break in the kneecap. To determine the extent of the fracture, a skiograph was taken, and the plate showed a break of a more serious nature than had been feared. Water on the knee has also developed, and it will be some days even before the third baseman gets out of the hospital.

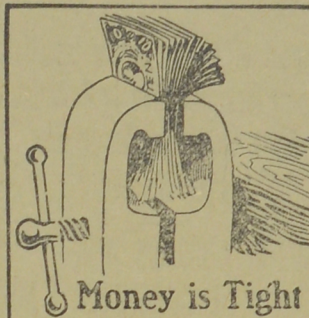
