CHRISTIAN CHURCH CONVENTION

Louisville, Ky., Oct. 15—The Christian churches, or Disciples of Christ began their international convention in this city today. This denomination, which began about eighty-five years ago under the leadership of Dr. Alexander Campbell, is now more than a million strong. Delegates and visitors are here from foreign countries. Fully 20,000 are expected, by tomorrow.

While the annual review of the missionary and other branches of church work will occupy much of the time of the convention, other matters are slated for attention that promise to make the convention one of unusual interest and importance. For some years a committee on unification has been at work, and will report in favor, so it is understood, of one convention, somewhat on the lines of the Baptists. It is believed that the report of the committee will provoke spirited discussion.

One cannot estimate the value of the influence of a life like that of Dr. James R. Inch. There are men and women in all parts of Canada who have been influenced by his ideals and his example. In his educational work during a long life he was brought into contact with very many minds in the formative stage, and gave direction to their thoughts and ambitions. His was a long and honorable career, and he had the distinction of being associated at different periods with two great educational institutions in this province, as well as of being for another period as the head of the educational affairs of the province at large. He was a ripe scholar, a good administrator, and a man who devoted himself to the cause of education with zeal and success. Those who came under his teaching and the influence of his personality during all these years of active service are widely scattered, and there is not one of them but will learn with regret that for him the end has come. Dr. Inch was a Christian gentleman, a man of broad views and fine culture, and one whose labors in the cause of education in his native province have been of the highest value. He was in his own sphere one of the makers of Canada, and one who fully appreciated the prime value of character in the building of a nation.

Sault Ste. Marie, Ont., Oct. 15—Killing his wife accidentally in the bush, while hunting partridge, Thos. Leishman, farmer, some sixty years of age, residing near Iron Bridge, committed suicide. The body of Leishman was found lying across that of his wife, Leishman had placed the muzzle of the gun to his breast evidently, and discharged the gun by placing the ramrod against the trigger.

Leishman and his wife left home Saturday afternoon and went to the bush. Mrs. Leishman carried a shot gun, and her husband a rifle. The woman had been shot by the rifle. A dead partridge was found near by showing that her husband had shot it and apparently the same bullet had killed his wife.

GEN. ANDERSON RETIRES

Washington, Oct. 15—Brig. Gen. George S. Anderson who recently returned from the Philippines, where he had command of the Department of the Visayas, was placed on the retired list of the army today on his own application, after more than forty-five years service. Gen. Anderson is from New Jersey and was graduated from West Point in 1871. He saw considerable hard service first against the Indians on the western frontier, then against the Spanish army in Cuba and next against the insurgent natives in the Philippines.

MAGISTRATE KAY DISMISSED FROM

Moncton, Oct. 14—It is definitely stated here that the order has been signed for Magistrate Kay's dismissal from office and the appointment of Chipman A. Steeves, barrister of Moncton, as his successor.

It will be remembered that charges were made against Magistrate Kay and that Attorney General Grimmer was appointed a commissioner to investigate them. Hon. Mr. Grimmer's report has been filed with the government and in it his judgment was that some of the charges have been proven and he recommended that Magistrate Kay should be dismissed from office.

The appointment of Mr. Steeves is regarded with general favor here. He is a prominent lawyer and it is believed will discharge the duties pertaining to the office of police magistrate and commissioner of the civil court, in a most satisfactory manner.

SOCIETY'S 100TH ANNIVERSARY

Worcester, Mass., Oct. 15—Many of the oldest colleges and historical societies of America have sent representatives to take part in the centennial celebration of the American Antiquarian Society of this city, which opens with a reception tonight in honor of the visitors. The anniversary celebration will take place tomorrow, when it is expected that President Taft will be present as the guest of honor. Historical addresses will be delivered by former Congressman Washburn and Senator Henry Cabot Lodge.

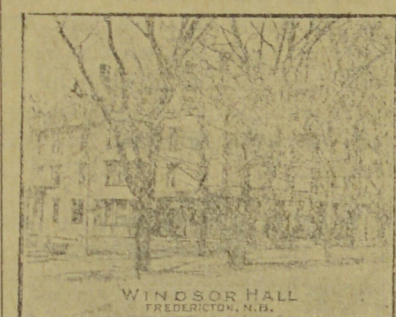

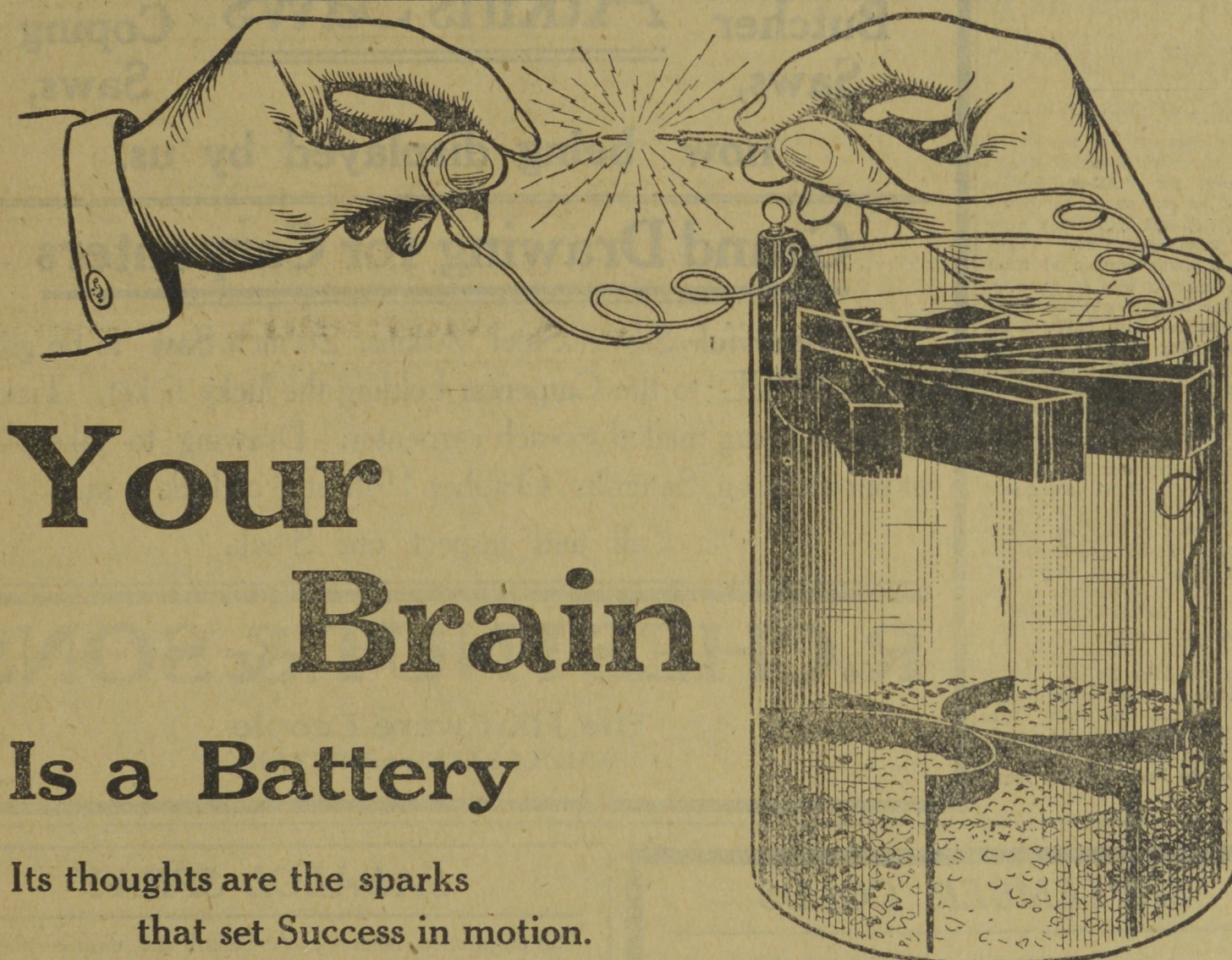
