Berlin, Nov. 15—The high esteem in which the famous author and dramatist, Gerhart Hauptmann, is held was given expression throughout Germany today by exercises in celebration of the fiftieth anniversary of his birth. In Salsbrunn, where Hauptmann was born, and in Berlin and other cities throughout the empire public observances were held by literary and dramatic societies, while the schools everywhere devoted some time to the life and works of the man whom many critics declare to be the greatest figure in German literature today.

FADS AND FASHIONS

Not all the collars rolling away from the throat belong under the Robespierre head nor, though that classification has been made elastic enough to cover a host of shapes that have not the remotest kinship with the original Robespierre model. The so-called Medici shapes have followed close upon the heels of the Robespierre fad and now one sees quantities of collars which, instead of rolling slightly and then turning down in deep points, flare out from the throat and roll at the edge without turning down. Of course, in all such shapes there is some faint echo of the famous Medici collar, and so the name clings to all the variations on the theme.

The Directoire lines have not disappeared from modish neckwear, have indeed taken on a new lease of life, rather spreading type of the high turndown or rolling Directoire collar having a place upon many of the coats and blouses, while the high turndown collar held close to the neck is much worn. This latter shape is usually held in place by a bow or strap across the front; but, like the close fitting stock with Medici flare at the top and open front, this class of Directoire collar some times is stottily boned or wired into place.

Chenille-dotted shadow veils are steadily forging to the front. Plain mesh effects are worn by a conservative few who do not admire the shadow veils.

The black or white Shetland veils are enjoying a continued popularity from last season, and the mazarine Shetlands are worn by many of the smartest dressers.

Accordion-pleated net is very much used for young girls' dresses. There are lovely little gowns, simply made of this material or of gayer pearl-white chiffon, into which is spliced a panel of shadow lace, laced to match.

A very evident trimming on the new neckwear is bevels. They are enamel and sometimes of fabric, but they give a smart finish to lace and linen.

Charming little frocks are made to match the fur st. worn. For instance, a hat of soft moles in a tan-o'-hemp style is simply trimmed with fur accents.

Fur trimmings have also extended to children's fashions. The hand-some winter coats for children have fur trimmel collars and cuffs.

HENRY G. DAVIS ENTERS HIS 80TH YEAR

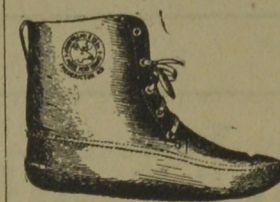
Washington, D. C., Nov. 16—Henry Gassaway Davis, who was the democratic nominee for Vice President in 1904, entered upon the ninetieth year today, having been born Nov. 16, 1823. Mr. Davis, who makes this city his place of winter residence, probably is the oldest citizen of the United States taking an active part in public affairs and questions. Since the civil war he has taken an active interest in public affairs, serving in both branches of the West Virginia legislature, and for twelve years represented that State in the United States senate, declining to run for another term. Just at present Mr. Davis is giving much attention to the efforts of his grandson, Stephen B. Elkins, Jr., to return to the United States senate, in which body he served by appointment for a short time following the death of his father. Now Mr. Elkins aspires to the seat of Senator Watson, whose successor will be elected by the West Virginia legislature this winter.

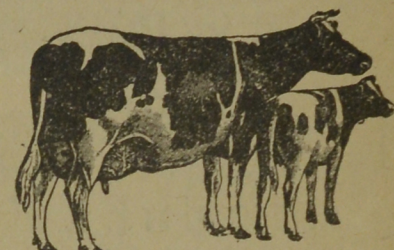

CHARLESTON'S "FLEET WEEK"

Charleston, S. C., Nov. 16—During the week beginning tomorrow a mighty fleet of warships will ride at anchor in Charleston harbor, where fifty years ago some of the most stirring naval engagements of the civil war were fought. Two divisions of the Atlantic fleet, comprising thirteen battleships of the first class, will take part in the mobilization. Included in the list will be the crack battleships Georgia, Vermont, Louisiana, Nebraska, Kansas, New Hampshire, South Carolina, Rhode Island and Virginia. A citizens' committee headed by Mayor Grace has made great preparations for the entertainment of the 12,000 officers and blue-jackets of the fleet. The city has put on holiday dress for the occasion. Thousands of visitors from the South Atlantic States are expected here during the week.
