## TURKS AND BULGARIANS

London, Nov. 17-The negotiations an armistice have failed and the Bulgarians today opened the attack against the Turks all along the Tchatalja lines. The heavy artillery duel continued throughout the day. It appeared to be a Bulgarian preparation for an infantry attack. The Turkish fleet participated vigorously in the defence at the Marmora end of the lines and presumably Turkish warships assisted at the Black Sea

nd also Nazim Pasha, the Turkish commanler-in-chief, in a despatch this evening, claims to have repulsed the Bulgarian attack and destroyed three Bulgarian batteries.

No news of the battle has beem reeived as yet from Sofia and no inormation as to the strength of the prces engaged on either side.

Nazim Pasha's headquarters are ear the Hademkeui' railway station. According to the latest reports the attle ceased with nightfall.
