## FLEA HUNTERS WILL START NORTH

(Montreal Herald)  
There are ostrich hunters, bear hunters, bird hunters, chicken hunters and the like, but Mr. F. J. Davis of London, Eng., who is at the Windsor Hotel, looks on all these with decided enmity.

Mr. Davis is a flea hunter. He is manager and "chief scout" for the famous flea manerie of Hon. Charles Rothschild in Herefordshire. The Hon. Charles is the wealthiest and most eccentric member of the great millionaire family. His particular fondness is the collection of rare species of fleas to which lively insects he devotes a large portion of his thought and time.

"I have been scouting for fleas for fifteen years," said Mr. Davis this morning, "and in the course of that time I have gathered 227 different kinds from as many parts of the globe. Altogether Mr. Rothschild has 427 distinct varieties, so you can imagine how difficult it must be to get any new ones. The object of my present trip is to organize an expedition to visit the Northern Hudson's Bay country for the purpose of capturing some Esquimaux fleas concerning which only last month Captain Scott told Mr. Rothschild that they were unique."

Mr. Davis recounted some extraordinary tales of the means whereby Mr. Rothschild has secured his large assortment of fleas. Special expeditions had been sent into the heart of India and Africa. Great expense had been undergone in order to secure rare fleas such as those which haunt the hippopotamus and the kangaroo in their most tropical homes. Prizes had been offered for flea contributions and for months in the mails to Mr. Rothschild were filled with letters bearing fleas of all sizes and all degrees of viciousness.

"A remarkable point in connection with a tour of Canada which I made six years ago," continued Mr. Davis, "was the fact that I found a prodigious number of fleas in Toronto, where I was able to add no less than seventy-three distinct types to my Canadian collection."

Mr. Davis has some very clever trapping devices by which he catches his prey. His favorite bait is fresh blood of a young pig.

The present expedition to the North Country will be undertaken by a number of old timers at the flea-hunting business who will meet Mr. Davis in the course of the week or so.

## TRIAL OF GUNMEN NEARING FINISH

New York, Nov. 17.—Sam Scorsie, Harry Vallon, Bridge Webster, and Jack Rose, the four informers, were expected to take the stand today in the trial of "Gyp the Bloo," "Lefty Louis," "Whitney Lewis," and "Dago Frank" for the murder of Herman Rosenthal. These witnesses were expected to be called to rebut the testimony introduced by the defense to prove its contention that the shots that ended the gambler's life were fired by two of the informers, and an unidentified stranger and that the four defendants relied to the scene of the shooting by Jack Rose, had no part in the murder.

Justice Goff limited the time during which the State may introduce its rebuttal evidence to the forenoon session today. The defendants' lawyer, in closing his case, announced that he would introduce no witnesses in rebuttal but his plans may be changed, after the States evidence is all in today.

Monday, it is expected will be devoted to summing up and Justice Goff probably will charge the jury on Tuesday morning, placing the case in its hands Tuesday afternoon.

New York, Nov. 17.—Deputy Police Commissioner Dougherty, the first witness said that Mrs. Mary Kidd, who testified yesterday as an eyewitness for the defense had told him that he had seen the shooting.

Albert Johnston, a newspaper reporter, testified that "Whitney" Lewis, had told him at the time of his arrest in Sullivan County that he was not in New York at the time the murder was committed.

"Bridge" Webster then took the stand.

"Did you shoot Herman Rosenthal?" asked Assistant District Attorney Moss.

"No, sir," said Bridge.

"Did you see the shooting of Herman Rosenthal?"

"No, sir," Webster denied that anything was said in his poker rooms on the night of the murder when the four gunmen were gathered there concerning Jack Rose desiring the gunmen to meet Police Lieut. Peckers men in order to furnish proof that he (Rose) had nothing to do with "Framing" Jack Zelig.

Webster went over the testimony he had given at the Pecker trial.

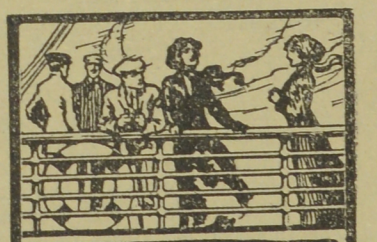
