LIBERAL MAJORITY IS STILL PILING UP

Regina, Sask., July 13—Returns came in slowly today, practically all the polls which were in touch with telephones or telegraph having already reported. Others are coming in slowly by mail. Heavy rains in Maple Creek constituency keep that vote still a doubtful matter and Lloydminster is in the same predicament. The few returns make the election of C. B. Marks, Liberal, in Rosetown, and A. R. Moore, Liberal, in Pinto Creek, certain, and add to the majorities of some of the Liberal candidates in other polls.

IMPERIAL CONFERENCE OF TEACHERS

London, July 13—The Imperial Conference of Teachers' Association, which was formally opened in London today under the auspices of the League of the Empire, adds one more to the series of important gatherings that has been held during the past few years with a view to knitting more closely together the various units of the British Empire. All of these gatherings have been held since 1910, in which league of the Empire was formed to promote co-operation among the countries and colonies of the Empire, mainly in affairs connected with education and to inspire personal and active interest in the great problems connected with the Empire's conditions and progress. Many delegates have arrived to attend the conference of teachers. The sessions will continue through the greater part of next week and at the close the delegates will make a tour of the British Isles. The Canadian delegation is headed by Dr. James L. Hughes, who recently retired from the position of chief inspector of the public schools of Toronto. Dr. Hughes is scheduled to deliver several addresses at the conference and will preside over one of the sessions.

HAY DEALERS AT KANSAS CITY

Kansas City, Mo., July 16—The annual convention of the National Hay Dealers' Association began in this city today and will continue until Thursday night. More than one thousand representatives of the trade from all parts of the United States are in attendance. The initial session was given over to the exchange of greetings, the annual reports and other routine business.

TURKS WERE ROUTED IN FIERCE BATTLE

Rome, July 15—A despatch from General Gariono says, that the whole division under his command attacked and captured Sisi Ally at dawn today, after six hours fierce engagement, with large Turkish forces from Regdalline, and Zeocara to the west of Tripoli. The Turks, according to the despatch suffered enormous and are now in full retreat.

HIRERNIAN CONVENTION

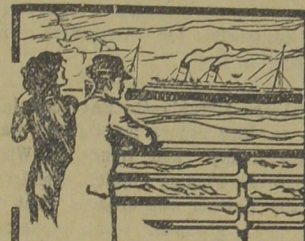
