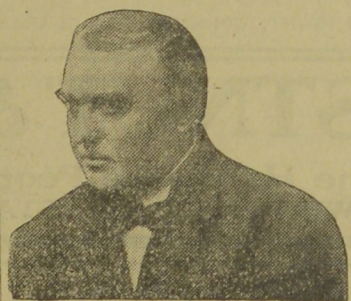

STATE-WIDE PRIMARY IN MINNESOTA

St. Paul, Minn., Sept. 16.—Minnesota's direct primary law, which has a second choice provision as its distinguished feature, will be given its first try-out tomorrow, when the several parties will name their candidates to go on State, congressional, legislative and county tickets at the general election in November.

The main State-wide contest so far as a gubernatorial nominee is concerned is between Governor A. O. Eberhart, who is seeking re-nomination, and a field of five rivals in the Republican Camp. O. M. Andrist of Minneapolis and P. M. Ringdal of Crookston are aspirants for the Democratic nomination for governor.

United States Senator Knute Nelson is seeking endorsement for re-election and is opposed by James A. Peterson of Minneapolis on the Republican side. The Democratic choice for the senatorship is Dan W. Lawler of St. Paul.

Republicans and Democrats have plural candidates for most of the places on the State ticket. Other contests are embraced in several of the congressional districts. The prohibitionists have practically an entire State ticket in the field and the Public Ownership and Socialist Labor parties have selected candidates for governor. The Progressives have not determined the stand they will take with regards to the Republican candidates. A definite decision as to whether an independent State ticket will be put in the field is expected to be reached at a conference of the Progressive party leaders at the end of this week.

ODD FELLOWS IN SESSION

Winnipeg, Man., Sept. 16.—The Sovereign Grand Lodge of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows assembled this morning for the formal opening of its annual communication. D. O. Cameron, the lieutenant governor of Manitoba, acted as master of ceremonies. Sir Redmond Roblin delivered the address of welcome on behalf of the province and Mayor Waugh spoke for the City of Winnipeg. Other greetings were extended in behalf of the Manitoba Grand Lodge, the Patriarchs Militant and the Rebekah Assembly. The response to the greetings was made by Grand Sire Cockburn of Indianapolis. At the conclusion of the opening formalities the delegates adjourned to Convention Hall, where the Sovereign Grand Lodge went into session behind closed doors. The gathering will continue through the entire week. Lavish preparations have been made to entertain the visitors and every minute of the time allotted to the convention is to be taken up with lodge discussions, drills, dances or entertainments.

BUSY WEEK FOR WILSON

Chicago, Ill., Sept. 16.—This week a large section of the Middle West is to have its first opportunity of meeting Governor Woodrow Wilson since he entered the presidential race. Governor Wilson will start his tour tomorrow with a speech at the Tri-State fair at Sioux City. Wednesday and Thursday he will address Democratic mass meetings in St. Paul, Minneapolis and Milwaukee. On Friday he will be the big attraction at the formal opening of the Ohio Democratic campaign at Columbus. He is scheduled to close the week with a speech in Pittsburg Saturday night.

RECORD-BREAKING SALE OF SHEEP

Weiser, Idaho, Sept. 17.—Sheep breeders and dealers from many sections of the country gathered here today for the opening of the largest auction sale of sheep ever conducted in the United States. The sale will last two days and will comprise 12,500 thoroughbred and registered sheep, the property of the insolvent Butterfield Livestock Company. The list of animals to go under the auctioneer's hammer includes 500 Rambouillet rams, 900 Delaine-Merino rams, 600 Hampshire ram lambs and several thousand full blood Rambouillet, Delaine and Hampshire ewes.

TO BE TRIED ON BRIBERY CHARGE

San Francisco, Cal., Sept. 16.—After delays and postponements extending over a period of several years, the case of Louis Glass, former vice-president and general manager of the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company, was called in the Superior Court today with a fair prospect for an immediate trial. Glass is under several indictments for alleged bribery, the charges growing out of the Ruef-Schmitz graft scandals of several years ago.

MORE DIETZ TRIALS COMING

Eau Claire, Wis., Sept. 16.—The term of court which opened here today promises to be made notable by the trial of the wife and the three children of John Dietz, whose defence of Cameron dam and its tragic outcome attracted wide attention two years ago. Mrs. Dietz and her three children are under indictment or assault with intent to kill, the charge growing out of the shooting of a deputy when a force attempted to arrest Dietz.

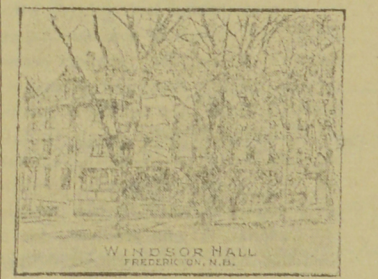
