CONSERVATIVE M. P. SUCCUMBS TO PARALYSIS

Ottawa, Sept. 16—Edward Kidd, M.P. for Carleton County, died this morning at his residence, North Gower, following an illness of several weeks, from paralysis. From the first stroke he was recovering rapidly and was able to take a few steps. Yesterday morning, however, he was again seized and lapsed into unconsciousness. Dr. Channonhouse of North Gower, and Dr. Kidd of Ottawa, were continually in attendance but were unable to hold out any hopes for his recovery. He died without regaining consciousness. The late Edward Kidd was born on Sept. 9th, 1849, in the Township of Oxford, Grenville County, Ont., of Irish parents. He followed the pursuit of agriculture from youth and latterly was engaged in the cheese industry. He was first returned to parliament in 1900 and again was elected in 1904 but resigned in favor of Right Hon. R. L. Borden, then leader of the opposition. Mr. Borden was elected for both Carleton and Halifax in 1908 and chose to sit for the latter. At the ensuing bye-election in Carleton Mr. Kidd was again chosen and in 1911 he was once more returned by a handsome majority. He was a member of the Church of England, and was unmarried. The funeral takes place at 10.30 Wednesday. Interment at Burritt's Rapids. It is expected that the premier and several members of the cabinet will be present.

LAKE LEVEL AN INTERNATIONAL PROBLEM

International Falls, Minn., Sept. 17.—The International Joint Commission on Waterways, composed of representatives of the United States and Canadian governments, met here today for a hearing in connection with the question of the levels of the Lake of the Woods and tributary waters. The commission will determine whether it is desirable to fix the levels of the lake, which is on the international boundary. The decision will be of much importance, since it will affect the dams and other works in the Rainy River, which empties into the lake, and the Winnipeg River, which drains it.

KNIGHTS TEMPLAR OF ILLINOIS

Peoria, Ill., Sept. 17.—The colors and emblems of masonry adorned the streets of Peoria today in honor of the Knights of Templar of Illinois, who assembled here in large numbers for the twenty-sixth annual convocation of the grand commandery. The opening session was held this morning and was preceded by a parade of the delegates. This afternoon the visitors were taken on an excursion on Peoria Lake. A dress parade and competitive drills are scheduled for tomorrow and in the evening the gathering will conclude with a reception and ball.

KING ATTENDS ARMY MANOEUVRES

London, Sept. 17.—King George journeyed today from Balmoral to Cambridge to attend the military manoeuvres, which this year are being conducted on a more extensive scale than ever before. The British army, with a large force of territorial cyclists and the army wing of the Royal Flying Corps added, are engaged in a practical demonstration of what may be expected to happen if a hostile force landed on the east coast, in the vicinity of Parwich, and advanced on London. The manoeuvres cover a large area of which Cambridge is the central point. His Majesty is to spend three days at Cambridge, during which time he is to be quartered at the Master's Lodge, Trinity College, occupying the same rooms that were used by Queen Victoria and the Prince Consort in 1847 and later by King Edward VII.

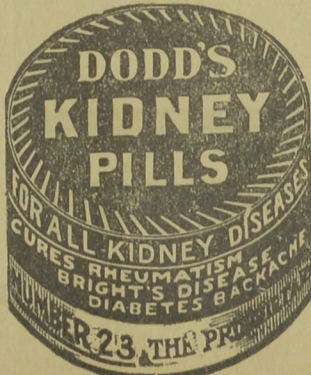
THE OLD MAN ELOQUENT.
