THE AUTUMN AND WINTER WARDROBE

In some large cities there are women earning good livings from acting as fashion advisers. This means that they are prepared to take a customer to shopping with her or for her, and advise her as to styles, materials, number of hats, gown, suits, and so forth, charging of course, a small fee for the service rendered. If this were done more generally, there would be fewer badly dressed women about. In Montreal it would seem that a fashion adviser might earn a good living, indeed, if one can by the number of women whose appearance cries aloud for experienced advice. The most extraordinary clothes and combinations of clothes are seen every day. The art of dressing well is not merely having good clothes, but knowing when and where, and how to wear them.

A great many women and girls spoil the effect by wearing totally inappropriate garments. A fine lingerie stock is not suitable for a chilly morning; a severe tailor-made is not suitable for teas; dressy hats should not be worn with plain clothes nor the reverse. Endless women go astray when they combine hats and coats. They seem not to know just what should go with the different costumes of the day. A plumed picture hat is often worn with simple morning frocks when it should be reserved for special occasions. In fact, plumes are the stumbling blocks of countless girls and women who seem to think that with a long ostrich feather or an imposing willow plume, can be worn anywhere and everywhere.

Color combinations are another fruitful source of trouble to the woman who wishes to be well dressed. Just the other day on St. Catherine street I saw a girl in a pink linen coat and a hat with red geraniums. The combination was an eyesore, although both hat and frock were prettily themselves. Any and every color worn together in the most haphazard manner.

The safest plan for the girl or woman to follow who wishes to be well dressed, is to stick to one color, all black all dark blue, all brown, or grey. For hats there is nothing more advisable than the all-black hat, which is to be worn this autumn and winter.

WILLIAMSBURG

Williamsburg, Sept. 18.—Mr. Daniel Gullison of this place died Sunday evening while attending church at Cross Creek. Rev. Mr. Scott, Baptist minister was holding service and announced that there would be an opportunity for anyone present to speak. Mr. Gullison arose and said he knew it was to be his last time to speak or testify for the Lord and started to repeat a passage of scripture when he dropped to the floor and never spoke again. Mr. Gullison was a man who for the last 40 years held prayer meetings and was a great Christian worker. His help will be much missed through this section of the county.

Mr. Gullison always expressed himself in favor of his days ending while at work in the harness so his wish was granted.

Rev. Mr. Scott, Baptist minister officiated at the funeral service and the remains were interred at Williamsburg in the family burying ground beside those of his wife who died in the same manner ten years before. Mr. Gullison was one of the pioneers of this place and saw hard times and plenty of hard work. He attained the age of seventy-six years and is survived by a large family of sons and daughters who are all married except one daughter and are in comfortable homes.
