-000 OF EXING OF THE NOVA-SCOTIA LEGISLATURE.-On Thursday last, at 2 o'clock, His Excellendy Sir John Harvery opened the last session of the nineteenth General As-sembly of the Province, with the usual formalities. The principal topics of interest prominently embraced therein are the increased state of the Revenue, the Consolidation of the Laws, the Rail Road Delegation, the new Postal ar-rangements to be effected, Reciprocal Trade with the Uni-ted States, and the necessity of an Asylum for the Insane. Without any important increase of Tariff the circum-sance of an nicrease of Revenue betokens unquestionably a revival in trade and commerce.

Upon the subject of the Rail Road, His Excellency evi deaily had nothing to affirm which has not been already before the public. Until the arrival of the next steamer doe about middle of next week, public curiosity relating to this interesting topic must of necessity remain ungratified. The subject of an Asylum for Equatics and Insaue per sons has constituted a commendable feature of, we believe every succeeding speech delivered by his Excellency since he has held office in the Colony. It is much to be regretted that the Legislature has not been induced to take a more
